I. Summary

This Administrative Investigation was initiated to review the on-duty conduct of Corrections Corporal Louie Ayala. The initial allegation stemmed from a personal misconduct concern alleged to have occurred between himself and a female inmate he was responsible for supervising within the Paws and Stripes program. The allegation involved Ayala utilizing his sworn position within the program to cultivate a personal relationship with the inmate.

Agency representatives contacted the female inmate, identified during the preliminary investigation to be Ms. Rylee Keeling. Ms. Keeling provided a sworn statement to investigators verifying the concerning personal behavior of Ayala, which warranted a formal inquiry and the need for immediate intervention.

On February 4, 2022, Chief Deputy Michael DeMorat verbally authorized an Administrative Investigation into the allegations against Ayala.

On February 9, 2022, Ayala was served Notice of the Administrative Investigation. Ayala submitted his resignation from the agency after service of the notice of an active and ongoing investigation. The resignation was effective immediately.

III. Witnesses

Rylee Keeling, Inmate

On February 7, 2022, Agent Howard Shelton and I met with Inmate Rylee Keeling to conduct a voluntary, sworn, audio-recorded interview. During her interview, she stated, in essence, the following:

Ms. Keeling had been arrested and detained at the Brevard County Detention Center on October 21, 2021. She was selected to be a "Trustee" in early November, 2021 and on November 31, 2021, she began working with the Paws & Stripes program in that capacity. *Trustees are an inmate with a non-violent history chosen for specific duties within, and at times, outside the jail facility. This designation can bring with it an opportunity for the inmate to earn credit towards their sentence.*

The Paws & Stripes program Trustees consisted of herself and two other inmates along with Corrections Corporal Louie Ayala and Canine Crew Supervisor Kaylee Montes. The program would begin each day at approximately 6:45 a.m. and end at approximately 3:30 p.m. The inmates in the program would be picked up from the County Jail facility by either Ayala or Crew Supervisor Montes and transported to the Paws & Stripes program facility. Her role as a Trustee at the program was to assist the program with whatever needs arose that day, to include cleaning cages, washing and training the dogs in their care. The female inmates never worked with male inmates and she described the frequency of her participation in the program as being almost an everyday occurrence.

Ms. Keeling provided a statement that lacked direct dates for specific allegations, but rather provided a statement presented as a general overview of her time as a Trustee with the Paws & Stripes program. The incidents she mentioned which occurred involving Ayala are as follows:

- Ayala hugged her twice at the Paws & Stripes program facility
- Ayala would transport her and other Trustees to Dunkin' Donuts and purchase them coffee
- Ayala would deliver her and other Trustees lunch from outside the County Jail facility
- Ayala provided her four hair ties
- Ayala purchased a radio from CVS while the Trustees remained in the County Jail van
- Ayala made plans to stay in a hotel in Daytona Beach with her when she was released from custody.
- Ayala created an account with Smart Communications using the moniker "Larry Flynt" and began communicating with Ms. Keeling
- Ayala dropped a piece of paper with a telephone number for her

Ms. Keeling estimated that within the first two weeks of participating in the Paws & Stripes program, she and Ayala began flirting with each other. She was not able to recall who initiated the flirtatious behavior, but confirmed it was a mutual interaction between the two. Ms. Keeling described the flirting at the beginning to include Ayala speaking to her about personal issues going on with his marriage and asking her about the status of her marriage with her husband. Ms. Keeling noted that she played along with the flirting in an effort to gain favors from Ayala, such as Ayala purchasing and providing drinks and food. At this time, Paws & Stripes had only one other Trustee, Inmate Cheryl Joynt. Ms. Keeling alleged that Ms. Joynt was not fully aware of the flirting between her and Ayala.

Ms. Keeling discussed the physical affection displayed between her and Ayala and clearly stated that no sexual interaction occurred between herself and Ayala. She stated Ayala hugged her on two occasions, each of those occasions being when he was scheduled to leave the unit and then when he finally did leave the unit. Those hugs were in front of other people and she stated Ayala hugged everyone that was present on both occasions. *Based on a sworn statement from Crew Supervisor Montes, it is believed the two alleged hugs occurred January 7, 2022 and January 14, 2022. These dates were based on when Ayala was initially scheduled to leave the unit for an assignment in the Transportation Unit, however, due to COVID, he did not actually transfer from the Paws & Stripes program until January 14, 2022.*

Ms. Keeling alleged that almost daily, Ayala would drive her and Ms. Joynt to the local Dunkin' Donuts to purchase and provide them coffee and donuts. This would occur immediately after being picked up from the County Jail facility and prior to transporting them to the Paws & Stripes facility. Ms. Keeling stated the behavior became the normal morning routine and that Crew Supervisor Montes was present for some of these trips. Ms. Keeling confirmed that Ayala would ask everyone present what their order was and would purchase and provide the orders to everyone. Ms. Keeling stated Ayala would make and obtain the orders through the drive-thru of the Dunkin' Donuts in Port Saint John while everyone was in the County Jail van.

Ms. Keeling alleged that Ayala would bring her and Ms. Joynt lunch on a frequent basis. She described the lunches as being from local restaurants such as Beef O'Brady's and pizza. She alleged that Ayala would leave the facility every day and return with the food.

Ms. Keeling alleged that Ayala provided her four hair ties at the program. She recalled discussing with him that she needed a hair tie while she was at Paws & Stripes. She stated Ayala would not directly hand her a hair tie, but would drop one at a time on the floor of Paws & Stripes and go find her to tell her that she had dropped a hair tie and that she needed to pick it up. Ms. Keeling stated she believed this was done to disguise the fact that that Ayala was providing her the items. Ms. Keeling advised the delivery was not a planned event discussed between them, she simply assumed he had purchased the hair ties and brought them for her since he was the one telling her she had dropped them.

Ms. Keeling advised that one morning after being picked up from the County Jail facility, Ayala and Crew Supervisor Montes took the County Jail van to a CVS and Ayala had Crew Supervisor Montes go inside and purchase a radio for Paws & Stripes. Ms. Keeling stated Ayala, Ms. Joynt and herself remained in the County Jail van in the parking lot while this took place. This purchase was performed after Ayala obtained coffee at Dunkin' Donuts.

Ms. Keeling alleged that she and Ayala had made plans to see each other when her sentence was completed on April 9, 2022. She told him that the first thing she wanted to do upon her release was to go to the beach. Ayala showed her a hotel in Daytona Beach that he had booked for them, but she did not recall if he showed her the hotel on a computer or his cellular telephone. Ms. Keeling stated she had discussed this incident and plan with Ms. Joynt, who encouraged her to go through with it and try to get Ayala to give her money. She stated that the money was to be in exchange for having sex at the hotel. Ms. Keeling also stated that Ayala would look up her social media pages (Facebook and Instagram) for her so that she could see pictures of her son. Ms. Keeling believed this was done using his cellular telephone, however, she never used his cellular telephone herself nor did he offer his telephone to her.

Ms. Keeling alleged that near the end of one day at Paws & Stripes, Ayala dropped a note on the floor behind her and told her she dropped something. She advised she picked it up and saw it was a note with a telephone number on it. Ms. Keeling stated she tucked the note into her bra and was then brought back to the County Jail facility. She alleged she tried to call the telephone number a few times but was never able to contact anyone. She alleged that she did not call the telephone number provided by Ayala the same day she received it and does not recall how many days she waited, but attempted to call Ayala. She stated she later destroyed the note, but had informed County Jail supervisors of the telephone number. *The telephone number provided to her on the note was believed to be 321-878-7515. A Google query of the telephone number identified that it was associated with an online escort business. A query of Ms. Keeling's outgoing call log indicated she attempted to call the number twice on January 31, 2022. These attempts occurred at 5:10 p.m. and 5:15 p.m.*

Ms. Keeling advised that on February 1, 2022, she received a notification from her Smart Communications account that a new account under the moniker "Larry Flynt" wanted to contact her. *Smart Communications is an all-inclusive inmate communication program utilized by the County Jail to manage inmate contact with civilians. It allows for tablet and kiosk-based access for inmate communications with friends and family.*

Ms. Keeling stated that Ayala had not informed her he would be creating an account to speak to her, however, there had been a canine in the Paws & Stripes program called "Larry" that everyone involved in the program knew so she assumed the contact was Ayala using the name. Ms. Keeling alleged that "Larry Flynt" attempted to send a photograph to her via Smart Communications, however, it was denied. She advised that she did not know what the photograph would have been. *This statement from Keeling was later proven to*

be inconsistent as an audit of her Smart Communications with "Larry Flynt" revealed that she had specifically requested a photograph of her and her son off her Instagram account. It was later learned that the image was denied due to it being a "collage" of pictures, and not simply one image, which was prohibited by Smart Communications.

On February 1, 2022, Ms. Joynt was released from the County Jail facility. While incarcerated together, Ms. Joynt introduced Ms. Keeling to an older male, John Mincy, via Smart Communications and described him as her "Uncle." Ms. Keeling took this not in the literal sense, but rather as an older male that Ms. Joynt would stay with while not incarcerated. Mr. Mincy began contacting Ms. Keeling via Smart Communications and they would discuss various personal topics. When Ms. Joynt was released, Ms. Keeling used her Smart Communications to stay in touch with her by messaging Mr. Mincy because she knew Ms. Joynt would be with him. Around the time of Ms. Joynt's release, Mr. Mincy made plans to visit Ms. Keeling at the County Jail, however, Ms. Keeling did not want to see Mr. Mincy as she was disturbed by an older male coming to see her. On February 2, 2022, Ms. Keeling stated she was venting in front of Ayala and Crew Supervisor Montes about being "creeped" out by Mr. Mincy and did not want to see him during a visit. Ms. Keeling stated Ayala then offered to contact Mr. Mincy and tell him to leave her alone, however, Ms. Keeling requested that he not get involved. Ms. Keeling advised that Ayala offered multiple times to contact Mr. Mincy to tell him to stop messaging her, which made her feel uncomfortable.

On February 3, 2022, Ms. Keeling received a Smart Communications message from Mr. Mincy's account, which had been written by Ms. Joynt. Ms. Joynt wrote that she was upset that Ms. Keeling had told Mr. Mincy he "creeps" her out and that his friendship with her was disturbing. After reading the message, she then believed Ayala had reached out to Mr. Mincy since Ms. Keeling herself had no contact with anyone. Ms. Keeling then sent a Smart Communications message to "Larry Flynt" stating "you just tried me" in which "Larry Flynt" began to question the meaning of the message. Ms. Keeling did not reply to any further messages from "Larry Flint."

Ms. Keeling stated that on February 4, 2022, Ayala approached her and asked if she was mad at him. She advised she downplayed how she felt to Ayala, however, she was disturbed and upset that Ayala would have involved himself in her personal life. She then approached Crew Supervisor Montes and explained to her what had been occurring.

John Mincy, Witness

On February 7, 2022, Agent Howard Shelton and I spoke with Mr. John Mincy by telephone. Mr. Mincy was hesitant to meet with us since his relationship with Ms. Joynt was a point of contention with his wife. We discussed his on-going communications and relationships with both Ms. Joynt and Ms. Keeling. Mr. Mincy confirmed he knew both, but did not know where Ms. Joynt was at that time. Mr. Mincy stated he had never been

contacted by anyone claiming to be a corrections deputy or Sheriff's Office member and was never asked to stop contacting Ms. Keeling.

Cheryl Joynt, Civilian

On February 7, 2022, after speaking with Mr. Mincy, I received a telephone call from Cheryl Joynt. Ms. Joynt refused to meet with Agent Shelton and I. She was told I had been looking for her and I explained to her the nature of my investigation. Ms. Joynt denied having any knowledge of an agency member or corrections deputy contacting them and ask them to stop messaging Ms. Keeling. Ms. Joynt was unable to confirm any allegation made by Ms. Keeling. Ms. Joynt denied any knowledge of contact between herself, Ms. Keeling and any agency member.

Kaylee Montes, Crew Supervisor

On February 8, 2022, Agent Howard Shelton and I met with Crew Supervisor Kaylee Montes to conduct a witness interview. In a sworn, voluntary, audio-recorded interview, she stated, in essence, the following:

Crew Supervisor Montes had transferred to the Paws & Stripes Program in June, 2021. She stated her primary responsibilities included transporting the inmates to the program, kennel management and training the inmates to work with the canines within the program. The program consisted of her, Ayala, and Corporal Mariah Biddle, who worked the opposite shift of Ayala. During December 2021, Corporal Biddle had a surgery and Ayala took that shift and began working with Crew Supervisor Montes for her shift (Tuesday through Saturday). The Paws & Stripes program is a seven day a week program and would utilize male and female inmates, however never during the same shift.

Crew Supervisor Montes noted several incidents while working with Ayala in which she recalled suspicious or uncomfortable behavior between him and Ms. Keeling. While she did not recall specific dates, Crew Supervisor Montes recalled specific events involving Ayala where she believed he was conducting himself in a manner inconsistent with agency policy and not within the expected norms of handling inmates of the opposite gender. She stated the events made her uncomfortable and she did not know how to proceed on reporting the incidents. She felt that since she was a civilian employee and not as tenured to the program as Ayala, that what he was doing was acceptable. Crew Supervisor Montes noted the following behavior from Ayala, which she found concerning:

- Ayala would bring the female Trustees with him to get Dunkin' Donuts
- Ayala brought her and the Trustees to the Port St. John CVS to purchase a radio
- Ayala created a "movie day" for the Trustees and would come in on his days off time to be with the Trustees

- Ayala displayed an obvious favoritism towards Ms. Keeling, which involved taking her alone to retrieve cleaning supplies
- Ayala brought Ms. Keeling alone in his unsecured agency van on a trip from the South Animal Shelter to Paws & Stripes

Crew Supervisor Montes stated she would typically get coffee on her way in to work and began texting Ayala if he wanted coffee as well. This evolved into them getting coffee together prior to picking the female inmates up from the County Jail. She stated Ayala then suggested waiting one day and getting the coffee from Dunkin' Donuts after picking the female inmates up from the facility. Crew Supervisor Montes clarified this began happening after Ms. Keeling arrived as a Trustee within the program and they would go to the Dunkin' Donuts in Port St. John. She described that this became a daily routine as the inmates would sit in the unsecured County Jail van while they went through the Dunkin' Donuts drive-through. She explained that Ayala would use the van each time and that the van supposedly to transport canines, thus it did not have a secured area for anyone to sit in besides a driver and passenger. The area behind them was just an open van and the female inmates were required to sit on the van floor. Crew Supervisor Montes stated Ayala would purchase everyone in the van coffee and would sometimes purchase donuts as well. She did not see favoritism directly towards Ms. Keeling during the events, however, she noted that bringing the inmates to Dunkin' Donuts in an unsecured van was not an appropriate practice and she believed the routine potentially troublesome. Crew Supervisor Montes advised that no oversight waiting for them to arrive at Paws & Stripes after picking up the Trustees, so the time they spent getting coffee was not being monitored by any supervisor.

Crew Supervisor Montes advised that one day after coffee at Dunkin' Donuts, Ayala brought the County Jail van to the CVS at Highway US 1 and Fay Boulevard, where he gave Crew Supervisor Montes a \$20 bill and requested she go inside to purchase a music radio for the program since the one they had was broken. Crew Supervisor Montes did not find this as troubling as some of the other incidents, but was unsettled that Ayala was left alone with two female Trustees in his unsecured van.

Crew Supervisor Montes recalled Ayala creating a "movie day" which she believed happened in December and, prior to switching shifts while Biddle was out, Ayala came in on his time off to facilitate his idea. Crew Supervisor Montes state he would play movies such as "Happy Gilmore" on his laptop, which was hooked to a television in the Paws & Stripes facility. Ayala told her that he wanted to watch movies and help the female Trustees with their future job resumes. Crew Supervisor Montes explained that Ayala's "movie day" plan had no direct link to any potential employment function and she found the idea not appropriate with the Paws & Stripes mission. After three occurrences, Crew Supervisor Montes decided to stop "movie days" from occurring. While Crew Supervisor Montes found the entire premise inappropriate, she never observed Ayala and Ms. Keeling doing anything inappropriate. Crew Supervisor Montes advised that the idea of assisting the inmates with resumes was not the purpose of Paws & Stripes and she was unaware of such an event having ever occurred in the past.

Crew Supervisor Montes advised on an unknown date in December, Ayala informed her that he was going to take Ms. Keeling with him in his County Jail van to retrieve cleaning supplies. The need for cleaning supplies for Paws & Stripes was commonplace and it was routine to get them, however, she specifically remembered Ayala insisting that he take Ms. Keeling with him and that Crew Supervisor Montes stay back with the other female Trustees so they could continue working. Crew Supervisor Montes was uncomfortable with this decision by Ayala, but did not prevent Ayala from taking Ms. Keeling. Crew Supervisor Montes stated Ayala took his unsecured County Jail van to Central Logistics alone with the inmate. She did recall them returning with the supplies.

Crew Supervisor Montes stated that on occasion, Ayala would leave his County Jail van at the South Animal Shelter located at 5100 West Eau Gallie Boulevard, Melbourne. On an unknown date in either December, 2021, or January, 2022, Crew Supervisor Montes and Ayala, along with the female Trustees, took a van down to the South Animal Shelter so they could retrieve Ayala's assigned County Jail van. Once arriving at the shelter, Ayala insisted that Ms. Keeling ride back with him in his van while Crew Supervisor Montes took the other two Trustees back to the Paws and Stripes facility. Crew Supervisor Montes was troubled by this request as it was highly unusual, but ultimately agreed. She recalled that Ayala and Ms. Keeling left the shelter several minutes after she had and arrived after she had to Paws & Stripes facility. She never saw any physical interaction between Ayala and Ms. Keeling and advised the time difference between arrival to the facility was several minutes.

Crew Supervisor Montes advised she was not aware of the allegation that Ayala had brought Ms. Keeling hair ties. She also denied any knowledge that Ayala would leave for lunch and bring the Trustees food. Crew Supervisor Montes stated on occasion there was leftover food and the inmates would have it, but that Ayala was bringing food on a semi-regular basis was not true. Crew Supervisor Montes was unaware of any plans Ayala was allegedly making with Ms. Keeling to meet her upon the end of her sentence and of any communication between them via Smart Communications. Additionally, Crew Supervisor Montes was unaware of notes which may have been dropped by Ayala for Ms. Keeling. She confirmed a hug took place between the two, but advised that it was when Ayala was leaving the unit and everyone present received a hug by Ayala.

Crew Supervisor Montes stated that the favoritism demonstrated to Ms. Keeling by Ayala was obvious, however, since she never observed any inappropriate interactions, was hesitant to confront him about the interactions. Eventually, on February 4, 2022, Ms. Keeling approached her and confided in her what had been occurring. Crew Supervisor Montes then informed her supervisors who then questioned Ms. Keeling.

Late in the evening on February 7, 2022, Crew Supervisor Montes received a telephone call from Eastern Florida State College. The call was from Ayala and he explained to her that he was working at the college and would no longer be using his cellular telephone. Crew Supervisor Montes stated this was because he had received a telephone call from Ms.

Joynt informing him that agents with the Sheriff's Office had questioned her about Ayala's relationships with her and Ms. Keeling. She stated Ayala informed her that he knew she would be questioned so he wanted her to "get on the same page." Crew Supervisor Montes stated that Ayala advised her that they needed to have the same story regarding the radio purchase and a microwave, which he had been brought to the facility. Crew Supervisor Montes stated that the microwave was brought by Ayala to use since the old one had stopped working. Crew Supervisor Montes stated the incident did not specifically involve Ms. Keeling and Crew Supervisor Montes was unsure why Ayala brought that up. She advised he did not request she make any specific statement or lie and did not discuss anything that she had witnessed i.e. taking Ms. Keeling to get supplies or taking her alone from the shelter. Crew Supervisor Montes stated she informed her supervisors after the telephone call.

IV. Subject Officer Interview, Louie Ayala

On February 9, 2022, Ayala submitted his resignation after being noticed of an active and ongoing Administrative Investigation. Ayala did not provide an interview during this formal inquiry.

V. Other Investigative Efforts

An internal audit was conducted by Information Technology regarding Ayala's assigned cellular telephone device. Specifically focusing on his text messages, I was provided the results of the requested audit and the document provided contained 772 pages of text messages from December 1, 2021 to February 8, 2022. I reviewed the text messages and found nothing of evidentiary value. It should be noted that per Ayala, his agency assigned telephone device was his only cellular telephone. Prior to resigning, Ayala intentionally reset his agency issued cellular telephone, without the consent of competent authority to do so, to intentionally delete any data. The data from the audit consisted of archived messages retrievable.

In continuing with auditing Ayala's cellular telephone, the device was delivered to the Digital Forensics Unit in an attempt to retrieve any potential data prior to being reset by Ayala. All attempts were negative to retrieve the data.

I received physical copies of the messages sent via Smart Communications between Keeling and "Larry Flynt." The initial contact occurred on February 1, 2022 at 9:51p.m. The final message was sent February 3, 2022 at 9:09 p.m. A message of significance was sent on February 2, 2022 at 4:42 p.m. from Ms. Keeling to "Flynt." The message stated, verbatim: "*It was good I just got back now I got to hop in the shower and hopefully get a nap lol do you work at the college tonight, did you have a good day?*" This message indicated that Ms. Keeling was aware "Flynt" to have secondary employment at "the college", which is Eastern Florida State College. Ayala is employed with security at EFSC and Ms. Keeling had knowledge of this and fully believed "Flynt" to be Ayala.

VI. Recommendations

This Administrative Investigation was initiated over allegations that Corrections Corporal Louie Ayala was utilizing his position as a Corrections Deputy to cultivate a personal relationship with assigned inmate, Rylee Keeling. Although sexual contact was not alleged, the behavior exhibited by Ayala as described by both Ms. Keeling and Crew Supervisor Montes indicated a lapse of proper protocols pertaining to the handling of inmates.

Whereas no specific dates could be provided by witnesses, each provided sworn statements describing similar behavior displayed by Ayala within the same timeframe. In conjunction with the displayed behavior, both Ms. Keeling, an inmate, and Crew Supervisor Montes, an agency employee, described similar interactions that Ayala participated in that made them uncomfortable.

The Administrative Investigation uncovered that Ayala used his position as a Corrections Deputy in the Paws & Stripes program to facilitate an improper relationship with Ms. Keeling. The investigation determined that Ayala would use the program to intentionally manipulate time alone with Ms. Keeling. This was evident in situations described by Crew Supervisor Montes: when Ayala insisted on taking Ms. Keeling alone for cleaning supplies and when Ayala insisted on bringing Ms. Keeling alone in his van from the South Animal Shelter. Both events as described are not acceptable by agency standards and Ayala was fully aware of his actions and the perception he created by his persistence in being alone with a female inmate.

The sworn statements presented a consistent pattern of behavior from Ayala, which created unnecessary agency exposure to potential high liability events. Ayala's unauthorized errands with unsecured female inmates in his agency van exposed the agency and exposed the inmates in his care and custody to potential injury. Ayala chose to deviate from the direct drive from the County Jail facility to the Paws & Stripes facility in an effort to purchase Ms. Keeling coffee and meals to further cultivate his relationship with her.

Prior to resigning from the agency, Ayala took measured steps to intentionally conceal his interactions by resetting his agency issued cellular telephone. While text messages are archived independently of the telephone itself, his methodical action caused the loss of potential culpable evidence of his inappropriate actions with the inmates.

400.00 General Professional Responsibilities:

Employees will not engage in any conduct that constitutes neglect of duty, conduct unbecoming an officer, insubordination, carelessness, or any other act that is likely to adversely affect the discipline, good order, or reputation of the Sheriff's Office or any of its employees.

Ayala's actions represent a wanton disregard for agency protocol and professional standards expected from all agency members. His consistent pattern of isolating himself with a female inmate directly associated with his employment function at the Paws & Stripes program represent acts that adversely affect the good order of the Sheriff's Office.

Based on the facts set forth in this administrative investigation, I recommend the following administrative charges for **Corrections Corporal Louie Ayala**:


