We (VolusiaExposed.Com) received and reviewed the information on the CD.

Thank you.

According to the BCSO investigative report - there was "BCJC Video"

(labeled pg 32, paragraph 4, of Tab 1, and other references) taken within the confines of the jail.

We (VolusiaExposed.Com) would like to incorporate that video within our pending article.

Please accept this email as a public record request for that referenced jail video.

Surely your office reviewed the video - during your review of the Use Of Force incident. Should your agency wish to declare a statutory exemption to our public record request - please

indicate which statutory exemption is being declared

We need the video to clear up some of our concerns of whether the BCSO effectively investigated the

events surrounding Mr. Edwards in-custody death. The BCSO CRIMINAL investigation does not reference

whether the jail conducted an administrative internal affairs (IA) investigation into the events surrounding Mr. Edwards' death.

Also, the video would clear up concerns of whether ALL participants to the event were properly identified, and interviewed

by the BCSO criminal investigators.

Some may suggest the following:

- 1. F.S. 943.1395(5) requires such an administrative investigation (IA) to be conducted.
- 2. It is noted, that during the BCSO's CRIMINAL investigation at least three (3) of the principle deputies involved,

refused to provide sworn statements - as is their U.S. Constitutional right to do so.

However, in an administrative investigation,

we hold the OPINION - under our LIMITED understanding of the 1967 U.S. Supreme Court decision - Garrity v. New Jersey - that these principle deputies would

have been MANDATED to provide sworn statements to BCSO internal affairs investigators.

These recorded statements would now be available for public record release.

3. Some may question, why the BCSO did not conduct the administrative internal affairs investigation - while allowing FDLE to conduct

the CRIMINAL investigation. Some others may suggest, that the BCSO conducted ONLY a CRIMINAL investigation to assist the principle

deputies in avoiding sworn statements being provided to investigators.

As state above, the BCSO CRIMINAL investigative report does not reference any IA investigation, and so far our PRRs for a copy of the BCSO internal affairs (IA)

investigation

has failed to provide us with a IA summary report. Further, we suspect that your office would not have released the CRIMINAL investigative file, IF the BCSO

had an active administrative investigation in progress. Such a release of records would have crippled any on-going IA investigation.
