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On 2/17/19 at 0506 hrs, I responded to Art.1 s.16(b)(5) to assist in an aggravated battery incident.

Upon arrival, I assisted in maintaining crowd control around the immediate scene. I spoke with two witnesses whose information was listed below in the canvass section. Ms. Trayce Jefferson did not witness the incident, but her recount of the incident was noted below.

I spoke with Mr. Andrew Rowland who worked for Giddens Security which Art.1 s.16(b)(5) Mr. Rowland stated he was dispatched to the 4th floor (Rm #462) in reference to a dispute. He originally thought the incident was at Rm# 452 and went to that room (which was located down the hallway from the incident). While around Rm#452, Mr. Rowland heard two loud pops and looked behind him down the hallway. Mr. Rowland observed the listed suspect yelling to call 9-1-1 because he shot a guy.

Mr. Rowland notified the front desk via radio and he assisted in controlling the initial scene until police arrived. Mr. Rowland overheard the suspect say he was punched by the victim and had his tooth broken. Mr. Rowland stated the suspect had a black handgun which he holstered back on his side. He did not have any further to provide.

According to Mr. Morales he looked through the peep hole on his hotel room door (#406) after he heard the knocking and saw a hispanic male kneeling in front of the door. He then saw the victim walk down the hall way and knock on another door and shortly thereafter he saw a female come to the victim's aide. Mr. Morales then heard a loud dispute and he then saw the arrival of officers.

The shooting occurred inside room 464 of the Art.1 s.16(b)(5)

At the time of the shooting Art.1 s.16(b)(5)

DESCRIPTION OF INJURIES

Art.1 s.16(b)(5) suffered multiple gunshots wounds to his abdomen. He also suffered an unknown injury to his chest. Art.1 s.16(b)(5) had a bloody lip and was missing a tooth.

BEGINNING THE INVESTIGATION

Sunday, 02/17/2019 @ 0555

Detective K.S. Brown and I were requested to respond to Art.1 s.16(b)(5) in reference to a person shot. Detective Brown responded to UF Health and I responded to Baptist Hospital.

0608

I arrived at 801 Prudential Dr (Baptist Downtown) ER room 33 to speak with Art.1 s.16(b)(5) advised she was the Art.1 s.16(b)(5) who was shot inside Art.1 s.16(b)(5) She informed me she was in town for the PBR rodeo at the arena. Art.1 s.16(b)(5) were hanging out with a black male around 40 yoa with short hair in a separate room they were not staying in. Art.1 s.16(b)(5) was asked to get a bottle of Courvoisier by the black male and bring it back to where they were hanging out. Art.1 s.16(b)(5) could not remember if she was able to get the liquor or not. At some point she was walking in the hallway and heard three or four gunshots

and then [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] said, "You shot me." [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] immediately ran downstairs and out of the building. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] could not remember how she got to the hospital. She stated she would not be able to recognize the black male if she saw him again.

0645

I arrived at [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] and was provided information by Ofc. Bego the scene was located in the hallway to the immediate left after exiting the elevator to the fourth floor. I was also provided the name of the person who was shot [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] and the person who shot him [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)]. Ofc. Bego advised [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was in the backseat of her patrol car. The hotel provided me the room number for [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] I located [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] in the backseat of Ofc. Bego's patrol car and asked him to sign a consent to search form for his room, which he agreed and completed outside of the patrol car.

0700

I spoke with Giddens Security Guard, Andrew Rowland, who stated he was notified by the front desk that room 462 reported a fight. Rowland advised Giddens Security is [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] Rowland was not provided details of whether it was in a room or hallway. Rowland got to the fourth floor from the elevator and immediately walked right out of the elevators. As soon as he got to the right side rooms of the fourth floor he heard two or three gunshots come from the left side of the fourth floor. He went to the left side and saw [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] crawl out of room 464. He then saw [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] on the phone and Rowland was told by [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] "Call 911, I just shot a guy." [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] then told [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] "You shouldn't have punched me in the jaw and broke my tooth out." [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] then walked down the hallway towards his guys in his motorcycle group (#1 Stunnas). Rowland then saw a black female begin to administer first aid to [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] He did not see [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] near the room or run by him.

0735

I went upstairs to the incident location, which was taped off and held by Ofc. Stevenson. Ofc. Stevenson secured the scene to prevent it from being disturbed. I found several white towels with blood on them, a torn black t-shirt, cowboy boots, and a black semi-automatic pistol on the ground outside of room 464. I searched room 464 along with Crime Scene Detective Amponin. Upon entry to the room I found a black boot print on the bathroom door and the door jamb broken into multiple pieces as if it was kicked open. There was blood on various spots on the interior walls along with the carpet in the room. A chair located in the far left corner of the room contained two shell casings along with a human tooth. A trucker style white mesh hat had blood on it lying on the floor next to the chair. A #1 Stunnas hat was located next to the trucker hat close to the AC unit. One additional shell casing was located on the floor near the chair.

0746

I knocked on room 462 who initially called in the fight to the front desk, but received no answer. I located [F.S.119.071(3)] outside the hallway room 464 is located. There was also [F.S.119.071(3)] that appeared to face the elevator for the fourth floor.

0825

I went to Baptist Hospital to speak with [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] again. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] confirmed the name of [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)]. She stated they were in town for the rodeo and they were drinking all night after the rodeo downstairs at the hotel and in the room. She advised they were invited to a club by the motorcycle club and left the club after having one drink. She does not remember anything about the club or what happened at the club other than having one drink. She remembered at some point in the night she was shown a black semi-automatic pistol by "the man who shot [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)], but it was earlier in the night. She stated she could not remember anything else in the night and does not remember ever being in the room. She stated [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] never put his hands on her; she was not touched inappropriately by anyone from the motorcycle group.

I asked Dr. Thivierge (ER Doctor, Baptist Hospital Downtown) if [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] had any injuries to her person and she advised there was no bruising or swelling to any part of her body.

0858

[Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was transported to the Police Memorial Building (PMB) by Ofc. Stevenson and interviewed in Homicide room 2. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] interview was audio and video recorded. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] stated he met a couple outside the hotel when he was with a couple of guys. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] seemed like a "nice, good couple" and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] invited them to an event they were having at "The Armory". After they got back from "The Armory" they all continued drinking having a good time and partying. During the course of the night [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] went up to the room to get something, [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] asked her if she could go to his room and get his other bottle of Courvoisier. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] went upstairs, back down and didn't know which key belonged to who because all of the key cards are black. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] went upstairs to make sure they had their appropriate keys and while upstairs she invited [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] They went to [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] room and sat and talked, then eventually went back downstairs. While downstairs they all took pictures and "smoked".

Sometime in the night [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] lost the keys to his room, but [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was so drunk he never realized they were in his pocket. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] went to the parking lot to look for his keys and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] went inside to the front desk to get a key. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] lets go up to my room but before they went upstairs they waited for [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] to return. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] if he found his keys and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] replied, "No." [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] he could get a new key from the front desk if he needed to. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] stated he believes [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was already waiting on the fourth floor when he and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] got on the elevator to go to the fourth floor. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] again if he found his keys and he was "laughing and tripping and everything." [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] went through [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] pockets and found his keys.

[Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] went to his room and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] walked in right behind him. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was still standing near the elevator and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] went into [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] bathroom and locked the door. While [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was in the bathroom [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] began putting his stuff in his bags. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] opened his room door and saw [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] walking down the hall and he tells [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] "Yo man, we in here." [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] came in the room, looks around, and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] tells [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] is in the bathroom. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was standing by the bed when [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] tries to open the bathroom

door and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] explains to [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] the door is locked. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] went "from having a good time to crazy jealous psycho, kicking the door down." [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] asked [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] what he was doing and tried to calm [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] down. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] then hit [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] with a closed fist in the mouth, [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] came out of the bathroom and tried to calm [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] down, and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] managed to get [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] on the ground in some kind of way and had [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] pinned to the ground. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] pushes [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] back into the chair with [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] forearm over his neck. While [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was messing with [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was able to get his gun out from his hip and chamber a round. At this point in time [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] is holding [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] left arm up by the wrist near the top of the chair and holding [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] right arm down by his side. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was still trying to calm [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] down, and told [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] he "fucked up his mouth, you're tripping." [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] lets up for a minute and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was able to get the gun on his lap. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] said, "I don't care if you got that stuff, you ain't going to do nothing." [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was still trying to calm [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] down while he was yelling. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] still had [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] arm in the air and began snarling at [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] saying, "I'm going to destroy you, I'm going to destroy you, I'm going to destroy you." [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] stated the whole time he was thinking, "What can I do?" [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] didn't want to shoot [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] has never shot anyone in his life. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] stated the way [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was acting it was going to be "him [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] or me [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)]" [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] shot the gun one time and he thinks a bullet hit [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] but he wasn't sure. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] jumped up, but did not disengage, and continued fighting with [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] so [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] shot two more times in quick succession. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] then fell to the ground and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] immediately went outside into the hallway. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] then got up, ran out of the room towards the right, and down the hallway before [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] got out of the room. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] then holstered his weapon and flagged down the security guard and said, "I just had to shoot this guy, call the police, call the ambulance for him." [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] then called his chapter president, Stanley (#1 Roper) and his wife (Thu) and waited for police to arrive.

When [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was asked about when they started hanging out, [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] stated he got to "The Armory" around 2200 on 2/16/2019 and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] were already there hanging out. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] got back to the hotel sometime after midnight on 2/17/2019 and he just remembers looking at the time and saw it was 0300. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] clarified they were upstairs in their room and his room. During the night [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] talked to him about making some money and moving "Ki's" (kilo's). [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] advised he doesn't know the first thing about that.

[Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] also disclosed during the interview that he had a valid [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was located in his wallet, which was located on his person at the time contact was made with him at the hotel. It was issued on 6/4/2015 and expires 6/3/2020.

0953

I contacted the on call SAO and spoke with ASA Johnston and he agreed there was no probable cause at this time to affect an arrest. ASA Johnston advised we needed to speak with [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] first to get all facts and information related to the case.

1320

I went back to [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] to conduct a canvass of the neighboring rooms. I went to room 465 and 466 and received no answer at the door.

1335

The on call JSO Technical Support Unit Specialist was contacted and Detective F.S.119.071(4)(C) responded to [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] to retrieve F.S.119.071(3) [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] He was unable to retrieve F.S.119.071(3) [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] and advised it would need to be taken to his office in order for him to make a copy. He advised F.S.119.071(3) [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was one hour and 14 minutes ahead of the actual time that F.S.119.071(3) [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] The hotel staff provided F.S.119.071(3) [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] as evidence to download the appropriate [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] needed.

1404

[Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was discharged from the hospital and brought to the PMB by Ofc. L. Cribbs #77642 for further questioning about the incident. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] stated her and [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] checked into the hotel around 1630 and went to [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] She advised they received a coupon for an appetizer from [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] They went to the PBR rodeo until sometime around 2200 and came back to the hotel where they met the #1 Stunnas. They went to hang out with the Stunnas at "The Armory", drank, danced and then left. They went back to the hotel and continued hanging out and drinking. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] remembers being shown a gun. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] stated during the shooting she was standing in the hallway or outside of the door. Prior to the shooting she believes she heard [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] arguing, but she never saw them get physical with each other. She stated nobody was ever physical with her either. She remembers during the night they were hanging outside the lobby, but she could not remember what room they were staying in.

Tuesday, 2/19/2019 @1300

F.S.119.071(3) and Michael Donn's cell phone were checked out of the property room.

1325

F.S.119.071(3) was taken to TSU for download.

1415

The cell phone was taken to CFI for download.

Wednesday, 2/20/2019 @ 1255

F.S.119.071(3) was picked up from TSU and delivered back to Art.1 s.16(b)(5) completed a signature form taking possession of the property.

1325

I contacted UF Health to get a status on Art.1 s.16(b)(5) condition. I spoke with Terri (RN), who advised Art.1 s.16(b)(5) was following commands and the medication he was currently taking would not hinder his ability to answer or comprehend questions being asked of him.

1336

I contacted Maxwell Snyder Armory (The Armory) at 904-693-5026 to confirm if they held an event with the #1 Stunnas, but I was unable to reach anyone on site.

2015

I reviewed F.S.119.071(3) and found the account given by Art.1 s.16(b)(5) matched what is shown on F.S.119.071(3). All parties hung out for a lengthy period of time before Art.1 s.16(b)(5) stated they went to The Armory. A few hours later they return and hang out outside the entrance to the hotel for several hours. They disappear out of F.S.119.071(3) for close to one hour and reappear downstairs for a few more hours. The incident itself never takes place F.S.119.071(3) due to only F.S.119.071(3) in the entire hotel working F.S.119.071(3)

Thursday, 2/21/2019 @ 0930

I went to 655 W 8th St (UF Health) and spoke with Kerri who advised they were finishing orders to downgrade Art.1 s.16(b)(5) and he would be taken out of ICU into a different room.

Friday, 2/22/2019 @ 0913

I contacted UF Health via phone and spoke with Brittany (Charge Nurse) about Art.1 s.16(b)(5) condition. Brittany advised they expect him to be discharged in the next few days.

1023

I spoke with Art.1 s.16(b)(5) in his hospital room which was audio recorded. A copy of the interview was submitted as evidence in the property room. Art.1 s.16(b)(5) advised he and Art.1 s.16(b)(5) got to the rodeo around 1800 after checking into the hotel between 1700 and 1800. They went to Art.1 s.16(b)(5) for appetizers before heading to the rodeo. They left the rodeo around 2200 before heading back to the hotel. Art.1 s.16(b)(5) remembers while hanging out at the hotel he got into a confrontation with a black male in a gray shirt. Sometime during the night Art.1 s.16(b)(5) was approached about drugs. Art.1 s.16(b)(5) said the weight the heavy set male was talking about moving is way above him. Art.1 s.16(b)(5)

Art.1 s.16(b)(5) believes someone in this group was wearing red clothing, but unsure what part of his clothing was red. Art.1 s.16(b)(5) doesn't recall anything about the shooting and he didn't feel he was that intoxicated to recall that information.

1330

I spoke with Special Prosecution Division Chief Joe Licandro and he advised to continue the investigation and put together any and all evidence and information that could be pertinent to the case.

1455

I picked up item 2-10 (cell phone) from the property room and brought it back to Art.1 s.16(b)(5) in his hospital room. He provided me with three phone numbers that he either called or called him. He stated the three numbers he was providing were from members of the #1 Stunnas. At 0624 and 0657 a phone call was received while Art.1 s.16(b)(5) was in the hospital from 904-202-2046 (Baptist Hospital). At 0226 a call was conducted with Bossman (901-336-3124). Art.1 s.16(b)(5) stated this was the man in the red clothing. Another call was conducted at 0221 with Art.1 s.16(b)(5) then completed a signature form taking ownership of his property.

Monday, 2/25/2019 @ 1455

I contacted the registered occupant of room 461, Maurice Smith, at 267-245-3928. Smith advised he was in town for a #1 Stunnas anniversary party. Smith stated while he was at the hotel he noticed a white male around 5'10" to 6' wearing a black Pittsburgh Steelers shirt and a hat. Smith remembers him because they talked about sports with each other. Art.1 s.16(b)(5) started the conversation

with him because Smith was wearing a Philadelphia Eagles hat. He stated he could recognize his voice because the entire night he was being loud and was “belligerently” drunk for hours. Smith advised other than talking about sports Smith didn’t speak to [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] much, but saw [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] talking with other people in his party. Smith remembers seeing [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] walk up and down the hallway, outside the hotel, and in the lobby throughout the night and constantly heard his voice. When Smith was inside his hotel room he heard [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] say to someone, “Shut up, I’m going to kill you. I’m going to end you.” Smith then heard three gunshots and he heard a different male voice say, “I just shot somebody call the cops.” Smith opened the door and saw [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] on the ground.

I contacted the registered occupant of room 462, Dianna Harris, at 773-314-6536. Harris advised she was staying in room 201 and does not have the contact information for John Hicks who was the other registered occupant of the room. The hotel had no contact information for John Hicks.

Tuesday, 2/26/2019 @ 1136

Donn’s cell phone download was retrieved from Computer Forensics Investigations. Donn’s cell phone was returned back to the property room as evidence.

Wednesday, 2/27/2019 @ 1142

I contacted the registered occupant of 463, Rachel Reherek, at 440-506-2614, but was unable to reach her. A voicemail was left with a request for her to call back.

I contacted the registered occupant of 465, Sane Singh, at 321-663-5894, but was unable to reach them. I could not leave a voicemail due to the mailbox being full.

I contacted the registered occupant of 466, Terrence Russell, at 773-691-8359, but was unable to reach him. A voicemail was left with a request for him to call back.

1204

I contacted the hospital and confirmed [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] was still a patient in the hospital and had not been released.

1930

I reviewed F.S.119.071(3) [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] and saw [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] hanging around and talking with several members of the #1 Stunnas, including [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] F.S.119.071(3) appears to match the story provided by [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)]

Friday, 3/1/2019 @ 1100

I met with Joe Licandro along with Sgt. Goldfein, Sgt. B. Baker, Det. Brown, and Det. P. Bodine in order to discuss the case further and speak with [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] via conference call. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] advised he has “No hatred for him, whatsoever.” He believes [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] has suffered enough and thinks he may lose his job over this incident since he works for a [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] He stated he would leave any decision on whether to prosecute up to the SAO.

Tuesday, 3/5/2019 @ 1015

Rachel Reherek called back and stated she did not see or hear anything. Reherek only heard someone scream after the shooting occurred. Reherek did not observe anybody arguing, nobody was involved in any altercations, and nothing seemed out of the norm. The Stunnas were always nice and polite to her while she was there, and they kept the music down when they knew everyone else in the hotel was trying to sleep.

Saturday, 3/19/2019 @ 1600

I reviewed the cell phone download of [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)]. At 0442 [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] made a phone call to 305-967-0762 (#1 Roper) that lasted one minute 41 seconds. He then made a call to 404-423-5625 (Thu Cell) that lasted 24 seconds. He called Thu Cell again at 0446 that lasted five minutes. [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] previously stated in his interview he called his chapter president and his wife immediately following the shooting.

Tuesday, 3/12/2019 @ 1430

I met with Joe Licandro and presented him with all evidence and documentation related to the case. Licandro advised he would contact me when a decision is made on the case.

Monday, 3/25/2019 @ 1009

I received the final disposition statement from Joe Licandro in reference to this case.

In reference to the Aggravated Battery with a Deadly Weapon against [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] prosecution determined the facts surrounding the incident matched [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] explanation for his actions as self-defense.

In reference to the Simple Battery charge against [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] prosecution was declined at the request of [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)]

In reference to the Criminal Mischief charge against [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] prosecution determined that [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] could have had a genuine concern for [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] safety and in doing so lacked the requisite for intent to commit the crime of criminal mischief. Therefore, [Art.1 s.16(b)(5)] would not be prosecuted for this crime.
