The trial began September 18, 2017 and ended October 10, 2017. My co-counsel was Assistant State Attorney Justin Keen. The defense was represented by Greg Eisenmenger & Scott Robinson. This was a Capital Sexual Battery and Child Pornography case with 55 counts presented to a jury during trial. Several issues were dealt with during the three-year pendency of the case, including Child Victim Hearsay, a Motion to Sever Counts, a Motion to Dismiss, a Motion for a Statement of Particulars, a Williams Rule notice, digital forensics and Juror Interviews. The Defendant was sentenced to two consecutive life sentences followed by a total 30 years DOC followed by lifetime sex offender probation. I was lead counsel and handled all of the pre-trial motions and conducted 70% of the jury trial.

As a result, I have seen first hand and appreciate the schedules of private attorneys who need to be in multiple courtrooms on the same morning while balancing the needs of their practice.

As a trial attorney, who is in court almost every day, I have a firm understanding of the evidence code and the proper procedures to be followed pre-trial, during trial and post-trial. I tend to stay calm even when other attorneys are disrespectful, or out of line. My commitments to professionalism and honesty urge me to strive to ensure the rule of law is followed, even if it is contrary to my position.
