Mr. Brown:

In the past - your insights have been very helpful to us (VolusiaExposed.Com).

We again seek your guidance - in understanding a "difficulty" we are having within the Passion Lucas death investigation.

According to your recent media release (see attached web link) your office has offered a "Forensic Report" that was used as your office's justification for not prosecuting Suzanna Norris regarding Lucas' tragic death. https://sa18.org/press/id/673

We have reviewed the police body cam video attached to the Norris / Lucas matter (see attached screen shot) – as well as reviewing the provided forensic report (see below web link). http://www.sa18.org/own/sitewide/Florida%20Forensic%20Eng%20Report%20R.pdf

On page 3 of the forensic report – the report appears to allege - that Norris would have needed approximately 107.5 to 147 feet of vehicle travel space to have effectively reacted to Lucas' entry into the path of the vehicle. (based on the vehicle estimated speed of travel).

The forensic report also appears to document that based on Lucas' "dark" clothing – and given the available lighting – that Norris would have needed approximately 155 ft of vehicle travel space in order to have reacted to Lucas' entry into the path of the vehicle.

Therefore given the above – according to the forensic report - Norris did not have enough reaction time to avoid striking Lucas.

However, video evidence seems to suggest that Lucas was wearing white pants with a red top. Can you confirm or deny that apparent observation? (see attached screen shot of police body cam video - as well as video web link). https://www.facebook.com/100040239247227/videos/1131656400935562/

If Lucas was in fact wearing "white" colored pants – then that would most certainly change the reaction time calculus – and that new calculus would most likely cancel out the State Attorney's argument that "accident [was] unavoidable by the [vehicle] driver".

With this new "reaction time" calculus – then an obvious question must be addressed – of whether Norris' high blood alcohol level slowed her ability to react – leading to Norris striking and killing Lucas. (something that was not addressed within the "forensic report")

We look forward to any clarifications your office can bring to our concerns.
