Mr. Avallone – according to a June 1, 2022 letter to Ms. Jackson – you advised her that:

"Your age does allow the Judge to sentence you to juvenile sanctions. Juvenile sanctions means that you would serve out your sentence in a juvenile commitment program until you reach the age of 21 years. Only the Judge can choose that option. As an example, if you were convicted at trial, or if you pled, the Judge would only have two options:

- 1. A life sentence
- 2. Juvenile sanctions"

Also - during a press briefing – that transpired shortly after Ms. Jackson's arrest – State Attorney R.J. Larizza stated that Ms. Jackson could be prosecuted as an adult – but still be sentenced as a juvenile (see below youtube video – starting at second 30).
