The ME's policy is that when a death is being investigated, release of information re: the cause of death is to come from the investigating (lead) agency. This is in complete compliance with Florida's public records law. This way the ME does not release information that may compromise a criminal case. There are cases when the cause of death can be released prior to the completion of an autopsy. Commonly, people, including reporters, perceive the table top portion to be the autopsy, when in actuality it's only a portion of the autopsy. Tox reports and other pieces of forensic information are just as important even though the cause of death may be suspected, the cause of death is not confirmed until all pieces of information are considered.
