On September 22, 2011, a letter was received outlining concerns from an anonymous citizen. In the letter, the anonymous citizen noted the following concerns related to FDLE Resident Agent in Charge (RAC) Wayne Ivey:

How is it possible that FDLE Supervisor Wayne Ivey is allowed to campaign on duty for Sheriff of Brevard County? FDLE is supposed to be the premier law enforcement agency in the State of Florida and Ivey is an embarrassment to your agency. Ivey has politicked and maneuvered his way over the last few years into a position to run for sheriff all on the dime of the State of Florida. Ivey should be receiving a pay check from the Brevard County Sheriff's Office since that is where he has spent all of his time over the last three years. I am a concerned tax paying citizen of Brevard County, FL and I am appalled by such a blatant abuse of power. Please look into and address this matter for the reputation and integrity of the FDLE.
