INVESTIGATIVE REPORT

On Wednesday, March 4, 2015, the Volusia County Sheriff's Office (VCSO) requested the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) conduct an investigation into the use of deadly force by VCSO Deputy Todd Raible, which resulted in the death of Derek Cruice. The incident occurred at 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona, Florida, during a narcotics search warrant (VCSO Case #150005942).

On Sunday, March 29, 2015, from 1041 to 1101 hours, FDLE Special Agent Troy Cope of the Orlando Regional Operations Center conducted a second voluntary, sworn, recorded interview of Matthew Grady to supplement his original statement. The interview was conducted at the Dunkin Donuts located at 1540 Garfield Avenue in DeLand, Florida. A synopsis of the interview is as follows:

Grady recounted the events of Wednesday, March 4, 2015, which began with Grady woken up by a "noise." Grady was unsure what the noise exactly was, but that there was a "guy" standing by the front window by where he was sleeping. The "guy" also was shining the flashlight through the window. Grady indicated that when he was up and moving toward the front door, the guy said something along the lines of "hurry up" or "come here." Prior to the door opening, Grady did not hear any verbal identification indicating the "guy" was with the Sheriff's Office.

Grady stated, "I get to the door, I open it, walk out, close it." At this point, Grady is outside and now realized the "guy" is a deputy. Grady said the deputy "mentioned something about a search warrant," simultaneously with Grady being "apprehended" by the deputy. The deputy turned Grady to the left, toward the garage (right side of the front door), positioned close to the house. Grady ultimately ended up down on his knees and handcuffed.

Grady still did not know how the door got opened after he had exited the residence and closed the door. He saw one of the deputies with the "ram," but only as it was being dropped by the deputy, following hearing "breach." Grady said that after he heard "breach," there was a loud noise, Grady originally thought was the "breach," but realized it was a gunshot when he saw smoke. Grady did not see any of the deputies kick the door.

Grady was able to lean back and look into the door following the gunshot, where he saw Derek Cruice lying on the ground, near the door. Grady also witnessed Steven Cohron with his hands on his head, getting down onto his knees.

Description:Second Sworn Interview of Matthew Grady

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When Grady was outside, Grady saw four to six police officers near the garage area, who approached the front door when Grady was being secured. Grady did not engage in dialogue with the officers that came from the garage area; he remembers just looking down at the sand just off the front patio as he was being secured. Grady did not recall being asked if there was anyone else inside the residence or being asked if one of the cars in the front of the residence was Grady's.

Grady had indicated in the first interview that he had arrived at 831 Maybrook Drive the previous night before the shooting incident. Grady clarified that he had arrived that night from getting off work, and that he had been staying at the residence for the past few weeks before the shooting incident.

Grady stated during the interview that he saw two cameras on the deputy that secured him, later identified as VCSO Deputy Cody Cochran. One was on Deputy Cochran's left shoulder and Grady made a motion that the other was on Deputy Cochran's left chest area.

Following the interview, SA Cope got a description of the cameras, which Grady said were black, with beveled edges. Grady stated that he distinctly saw the lenses and that the camera on Deputy Cochran's shoulder, was close in size to a GoPro camera.

The sworn, recorded interview will be maintained electronically in the related item section of the case file, labeled INV-31.

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On March 4, 2015, at approximately 0933 hours, SA Danielle Gill and SA Daniel Wallace made contact with Samantha Sterrett, and SA Gill explained that the FDLE was conducting an investigation into the use of force incident. Sterrett agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the incident. SA Gill conducted a sworn and recorded statement of Samantha Sterrett in a VCSO patrol vehicle parked on Maybrook Drive in Deltona. A synopsis of the statement follows:

Sterrett resided at 831 Maybrook Drive with Cruice, her boyfriend of six years. Cruice did not own any firearms, and Sterrett did not know Cruice to carry any firearms.

Sterrett and Cruice woke because of a "bang" on the front door. After the bang, Sterrett heard, "Volusia County." Sterrett stated to Cruice that someone was "beating" on the front door. Cruice and Sterrett walked out of the bedroom together, and Matthew Grady was "screaming about something." Cruice went to the front door with nothing in his hands wearing black and red basketball shorts with boxers and no shirt. Sterrett was outside the bedroom.

Cruice was looking out of the front door peep hole when the door was "kicked" or "pushed" open. Sterrett stated she observed, "Somebody with a gun come through the front door, and I hear a loud pop." Sterrett stated that she could not see who was holding the gun, and described the gun as a "big black" handgun. Sterrett was unable to describe the uniform of the deputies that came through the front door. Sterrett stated after the gunshot occurred, "He [Cruice] had to of fallen to the ground because alls I heard was keep him on the ground, and I went to my room." Sterrett shut the bedroom door and "waited" for the deputies.

Sterrett was asked if she saw when Cruice was shot and she stated, "I saw the gun, and then I heard the pop." Sterrett stated that Grady and Steven Cohron were sleeping in the living room, and were the only ones that could have been at the front door with Cruice.

Deputies entered the bedroom Sterrett was in and her dog "kinda went after them." Sterrett was

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handcuffed and told "not to look around." Sterrett was escorted out of the house through the front door and observed Cruice lying on the ground.

The statement concluded at 0939 hours.

The audio recording of the statement will be maintained as INV-32 in the electronic related items section of this case file.

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On Wednesday, March 4, 2015, the Volusia County Sheriff's Office (VCSO) requested the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) conduct an investigation into the use of deadly force by VCSO Deputy Todd Raible, which resulted in the death of Derek Cruice. The incident occurred at 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona, Florida, during a narcotics search warrant (VCSO Case #150005942).

On Friday, April 3, 2015, from 1514 to 1541 hours, FDLE Special Agent (SA) Troy Cope of the Orlando Regional Operations Center conducted a second voluntary, sworn, recorded interview of Samantha Sterrett to supplement her original statement. The interview was conducted at Scorpio's Italian Eatery and Pizzeria, located at 2742 Elkcam Boulevard in Deltona, Florida. A synopsis of the interview is as follows:

During the early morning of Wednesday, March 4, 2015, Sterrett and Derek Cruice were sleeping in their bedroom at 831 Maybrook Drive. The bedroom is located on the back left (east) side of the residence, down the hallway, which is left of the front door entrance. Sterrett and Cruice were awake by "beating on the front door," described by Sterrett as "three loud bangs." The noise caused Sterrett's dog to bark. Sterrett and Cruice, unaware as to a reason someone would be at the front door, so they exited the room and proceeded down the hallway toward the front door.

Sterrett was behind Cruice as they walked toward the front door and Sterrett indicated that she did not hear anything as they approached. Sterrett stopped approximately where the carpet in the hallway ends and where the white tile for the foyer begins. Sterrett said that she had a full view of the front door and was approximately "five steps to the door knob." Sterrett stated, He [Cruice] went to the door to look out the peephole, and that's when the door came open,... [Cruice] took a step to the left and took a step back, and that's when the gun went off." Sterrett indicated that Cruice never made it to the peep hole and said, "The door almost smacked him in the face," which caused Cruice to move out of way of the front door, by stepping to the left and back from Sterrett's perspective.

When the door "came open," Sterrett said she heard an individual state "Volusia County," observed the "barrel" of a gun extend past the opened door, followed by a single gunshot. This happened within "seconds" according to Sterrett. Cruice did not state anything when the door opened. Sterrett stated, "He didn't have time to say anything." There were no commands of "Put your hands up," or "Show me your hands," directed at Cruice, according to Sterrett, adding

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"If they would have told him to freeze and get on his knees, he would have froze and got on his knees." Sterrett believed that Cruice's arms were by his side and were not at his chest and did not extend outward when the door was opened.

After the gun is discharged, Sterrett picked up her dog and "ran" back to her bedroom, shutting the door. Subsequently, deputies enter the room. Sterrett said the deputies initially pointed their guns at the dog, but Sterrett advised them that the dog was friendly. Sterrett was secured by the deputies in handcuffs and removed from the residence through the front door. Sterrett was then detained in the back of a vehicle.

Regarding the front door, Sterrett said that when they moved into the residence the door handle did not work properly, as the door would not stay shut, but the landlord had attempted to fix some issues with the door. Sterrett indicated the peephole has always had some "scratches" on it, but that she could identify individuals at the door when she looked out of it prior to the shooting incident. SA Cope asked Sterrett if Cruice shut and locked the front door prior to it being opened. Sterrett said "no."

Sterrett did not observe any of the deputies with a body camera / GoPro on their person during or after the shooting incident.

The sworn, recorded interview will be maintained in the related item section of the case file, labeled INV-33.

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On March 04, 2015, at approximately 0839 hours, SA Danielle Gill made contact with Kristina Rodriguez, and explained that the FDLE was conducting an investigation into the use of force incident. Rodriguez agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the incident. SA Gill conducted a sworn and recorded statement of Rodriguez in a VCSO patrol vehicle parked on Maybrook Drive in Deltona. A synopsis of the statement follows:

Rodriguez resided at 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona in the front bedroom with her boyfriend, Gerald "Jerry" Bishop. Cruice and Samantha Sterrett shared the master bedroom in the back of the house, Matthew Grady resided on a couch, and Steven Cohron resided in a back room.

Rodriguez and Bishop were in their bedroom asleep when a "loud noise" woke them up at approximately 0630 hours. Rodriguez described the loud noise as "Someone was kicking in the door." Rodriguez later stated that she, "Assume it was a gunshot from how loud it was, it didn't sound like someone banging on the door...it was just a loud bang." Rodriguez only heard one "bang," and did not recall hearing a knock on the door.

After the loud noise, someone stated, "Sheriff's Department" and that they had a "search warrant." Rodriguez did not hear Cruice make any statements. Sterrett stated to the deputies that, "The dog wasn't going to bite them."

Rodriguez "peeked" out of her bedroom and observed "cops." Rodriguez and Bishop stayed in the bedroom until a deputy came in. Rodriguez stated the deputies were not wearing a "typical uniform," however she was able to identify them as "cops." A deputy took Bishop out of the bedroom, and then Rodriguez. The deputy wore a vest with unknown writing on it. Cruice was lying by the front door bleeding.

The statement concluded at 0846 hours.

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On March 4, 2015, at approximately 1027 hours, SA Danielle Gill made contact with Gerald Bishop, and explained that the FDLE was conducting an investigation into the use of force incident. Bishop agreed to provide a voluntary statement regarding the incident. SA Gill conducted a sworn and recorded statement in a VCSO patrol vehicle parked on Maybrook Drive in Deltona.

Bishop resided at 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona in the front bedroom with his girlfriend, Kristina Rodriguez. Samantha Sterrett and Cruice shared the master bedroom, Steven Cohron resided in the back room, and Matthew Grady resided on the couch. Bishop knew Cruice for approximately ten years, and did not know Cruice to own any firearms.

Bishop was asleep with Rodriguez in their bedroom with the door open. Bishop was awoken at approximately 0600 or 0630 hours by at least one "gunshot." Bishop stated that the deputies did not "announce" themselves, and they just came into the house. A deputy "rushed" into the hallway and pointed a gun in Bishop's bedroom. The deputy told Bishop and Rodriguez to keep their "hands up" and to "not move." The deputy wore a t-shirt, black pants with a belt, and a vest. Bishop and Rodriguez were removed from the bedroom. Bishop stated that the lights in the house were off and it was "dark." Bishop observed deputies in the living room, however he did not hear the deputies make any statements. Cruice was lying on the ground, bleeding, and not moving or saying anything. Bishop did not observe the deputies rendering medical aid to Cruice. Bishop was escorted out of the house through the front door.

The statement concluded at 1033 hours.

Description:Sworn Interview of Gerald Bishop

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On March 4, 2015, FDLE Special Agents (SA) Daniel Wallace and Danielle Gill conducted a canvass for witnesses and recorded video surveillance of the incident. The area canvassed for civilian witnesses consisted of residence on Maybrook Drive and Westline Avenue. All interviews with civilians during the canvass were recorded. The audio recordings were maintained as related item to this case file (INV-36). In summary, the results reflect the following:

Higinia Mejia Martinez did not see the use of force incident.

831 Maybrook Drive

This was the address where the use of force occurred.

Juan Romero stated that he did not hear or see anything. When Romero exited his house he saw multiple deputies and yellow crime scene tape. Romero stated that his juvenile daughter heard pounding sounds, but nothing that caused concern, i.e. gunshots. According to Romero, his daughter did not see anything.

Romero added that he found it odd that there were always six to seven (6-7) vehicles parked at the house where the incident occurred. Romero stated that he did not know his neighbors and did not know who lived there.

Charles Leffler did not get up until after 0700 hours and did not see or hear the use of force incident.

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On March 4, 2015, at approximately 1730 hours, Special Agent (SA) Lloyd Randolph contacted Daniel Decamp, the owner of 869 Westline Avenue. The contact was to ascertain if their security video captured any of the incident at 831 Maybrook Avenue.

Daniel Decamp advised that the security camera was a motion sensor camera. The motion range only extended to the end of his driveway. Decamp attached his security Digital Video Recorder (DVR) on the living television. SAs Lloyd Randolph and Bill Lee reviewed the video during the timeframe that the incident. The security camera did not capture any video during the timeframe of the incident at 831 Maybrook Avenue.

Description:Surveillance Camera Follow-up

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On Friday, March 27, 2015, FDLE Special Agent Troy Cope of the Orlando Regional Operations Center conducted sworn recorded interviews of City of Deltona Fire and Rescue (DFR) personnel Engineer / Paramedic Edward Walker, herein Paramedic Walker, Firefighter Kody Oakes, and Lieutenant William Fitzpatrick. The interviews were conducted at Station 62, located at 320 Diamond Street in Deltona, Florida, from approximately 0820 to 0945 hours. The statements provided by the DFR personnel were consistent with the information revealed by the CAD report and radio traffic detailed in Investigative Report #2. A synopsis of the information obtained from the DFR personnel is as follows:

On Wednesday, March 4, 2015, at approximately 0630 hours, Engineer / Paramedic Walker, Firefighter Oakes, and Lieutenant Fitzpatrick were dispatched to 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona, Florida, in reference to a gunshot wound. Engineer / Paramedic Walker drove Engine 62 to the incident scene location and parked outside of the crime scene tape (Maybrook Drive and Westline Avenue) that had already been placed at the intersection.

Paramedic Walker and Lieutenant Fitzpatrick entered the front door of the residence where they encountered the patient, later identified as Derek Cruice. Cruice was lying on his side and was positioned near the front door, approximately 6 feet to the right of the doorway; Cruice's feet were closer to the door, and Cruice was lying at an angle to where his head was lying in the living room area and his feet were in the foyer. Paramedic Walker and Lieutenant Fitzpatrick were notified by a deputy that Cruice had been shot in mouth. Paramedic Walker asked Firefighter Oakes to retrieve a backboard from the firetruck.

A deputy was tending to Cruice. Lieutenant Fitzpatrick indicated the deputy had placed gauze / bandage on Cruice, and appeared to be applying pressure to the facial wound. Paramedic Walker said that the deputy was speaking to Cruice, stating, "Breathe, come on breath..." Paramedic Walker indicated that Cruice had a pulse, but was not breathing and was unresponsive. Firefighter Oakes returned with the backboard as personnel from EVAC Ambulance arrived to assist. Cruice was placed on the backboard and moved to the foyer to be

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placed on the stretcher.

Cruice was placed on the stretcher and moved into the ambulance. Paramedic Walker and Firefighter Oakes rode in the back of the ambulance to assist in the resuscitation efforts. Paramedic Walker provided the rescue breaths and Firefighter Oakes gave chest compressions to Cruice all the way to Florida Hospital Fish Memorial.

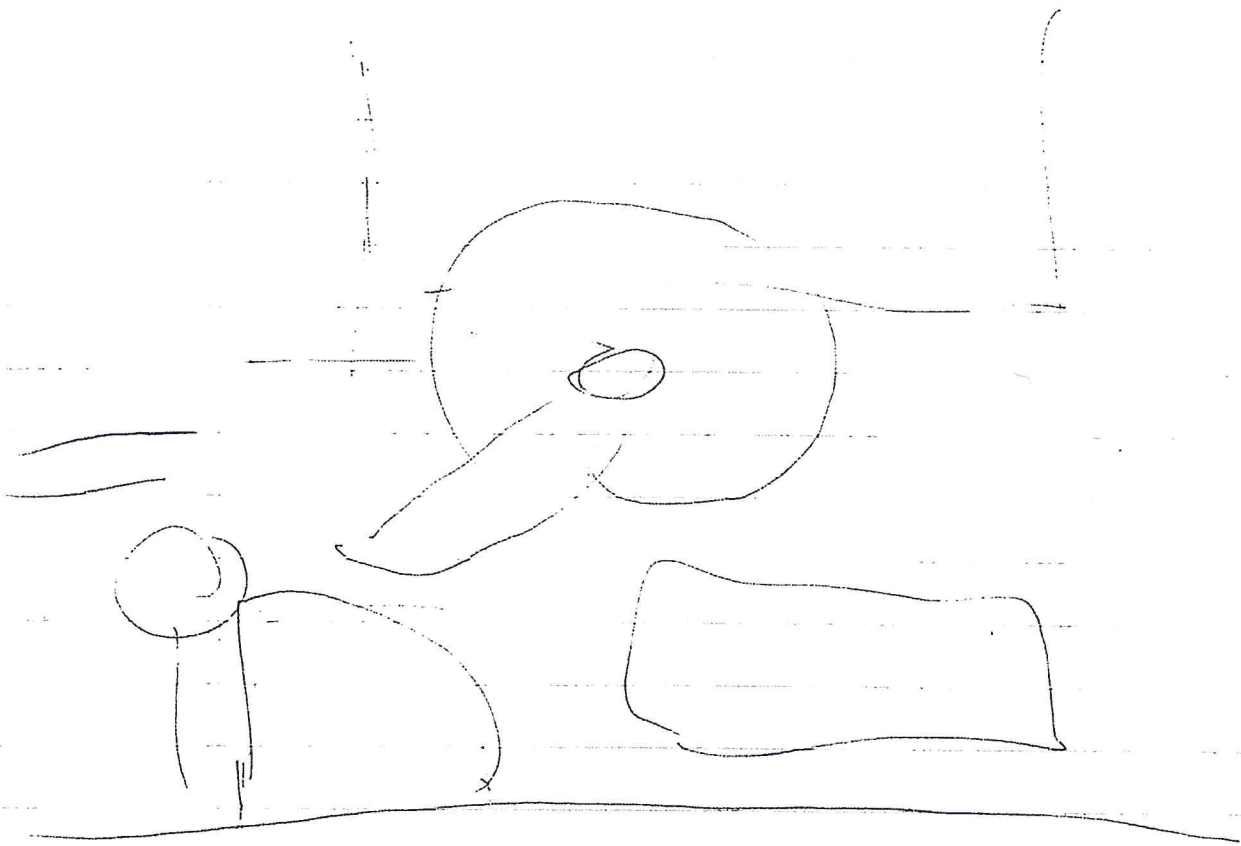
Paramedic Walker, Firefighter Oakes, and Lieutenant Fitzpatrick did not discuss the events leading to the shooting incident with any of the law enforcement personnel at 831 Maybrook Drive. They were advised that the gunshot was not self-inflicted by Cruice, and that it was a law enforcement officer who shot Cruice. Cruice was unresponsive and did not make any communications to anyone.

The deputy inside the residence was described as being in plain clothes with a bullet-proof vest on, and had facial hair. There was also a deputy standing near the front door in a "green" VCSO uniform, who made sure the crime scene was not disturbed any further after the emergency medical personnel removed Cruice from the residence.

Paramedic Walker, Firefighter Oakes, and Lieutenant Fitzpatrick did not observe any weapons or objects lying near Cruice inside the residence.

On Wednesday, March 25, 2015, at approximately 1340 hours, SA Cope spoke with Battalion Chief John Littell, via phone. Battalion Chief Littell indicated that he did not cross into the crime scene and did not participate in the aid rendered to Cruice at 831 Maybrook Drive on Wednesday, March 4, 2015. Additionally, Battalion Chief Littell stated that he did not have any discussion with law enforcement personnel on-scene regarding the shooting incident.

The sworn, recorded interviews of Paramedic Walker, Firefighter Oakes, and Lieutenant Fitzpatrick will be maintained electronically in the related item section of the case file, labeled INV-37 through INV-39, respectively. An incident scene diagram created by Paramedic Walker of Cruice's position inside the residence will be maintained in the related item section of the case file, labeled INV-40.

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On Monday, March 30, and Tuesday, March 31, 2015, FDLE Special Agent Troy Cope of the Orlando Regional Operations Center conducted sworn recorded interviews of EVAC Ambulance personnel Lieutenant Paramedic Elizabeth Payne, herein Lieutenant Payne, Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Michael Gallimore, and Intermittent EMT Kevin Anglin. The interviews of Lieutenant Payne and EMT Anglin were conducted at the EVAC Ambulance administrative office, located at 112 Carswell Avenue in Holly Hill, Florida, from approximately 0900 to 1015 hours, on Monday, March 30, 2015. EMT Anglin was interviewed at 211 Bush Boulevard in Sanford, Florida, on Tuesday, March 31, 2015.

On Wednesday, March 4, 2015, Lieutenant Payne, EMT Gallimore, and EMT Anglin were operating EVAC Ambulance Unit #236. At approximately 0630 hours a call was received regarding a "person shot" and "scene secure" at 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona, Florida. The EVAC Ambulance personnel responded from Orange City, Florida, from "post 2," near the intersection of Volusia Avenue and Enterprise Road in Orange City, Florida.

Upon arrival at the incident location, crime scene tape was already placed around the residence. The ambulance was parked just past the driveway of 831 Maybrook, on the street, on the right side (west) of the driveway. Personnel from the City of Deltona Fire and Rescue (DFR), were already on scene and tending to the patient inside the residence, Derek Cruice. A synopsis of what the EVAC personnel witnessed is as follows:

Lieutenant Payne rode in the back of the ambulance to the incident location. Upon arrival, Lieutenant Payne brought the "RSI medications" requested by the DFR personnel and entered the residence. Lieutenant Payne observed Cruice lying inside the doorway on his left side between the foyer and living room area. Cruice's feet were approximately five to six feet from the opening of the front door.

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Lieutenant Payne was advised by the DFR personnel that Cruice had sustained a gunshot wound to the face and had an "exit wound." A deputy standing just inside the door indicated to Lieutenant Payne that the gunshot wound Cruice suffered was not self-inflicted. Lieutenant Payne indicated that Cruice had "agonal breathing," consisting of four to six breaths per minute and Cruice still had a heartbeat.

Cruice was placed onto a backboard and prepared for transport. Lieutenant Payne said that when they were exiting the residence with the stretcher a deputy moved a shell casing and the "Tupperware" covering it to the left so the stretcher could exit off of the patio without going into the sand. The deputy immediately moved the casing and "Tupperware" back to the original position once the stretcher was out of the way.

Cruice was placed into the ambulance and transported to Florida Hospital Fish Memorial (FHF) in Orange City, Florida. Lieutenant Payne stated that Cruice went into "cardiac arrest" shortly after being placed into the ambulance and resuscitation efforts continued all the way to the hospital. Cruice was pronounced deceased shortly after arriving at FHF.

EMT Gallimore [Click for Audio](#)

EMT Gallimore drove the ambulance to the incident scene location. Upon arriving and parking the ambulance, EMT Gallimore observed a female in handcuffs with another deputy across the street from the residence. Additionally, EMT Gallimore witnessed a "deputy on his knees, crying...being consoled by another deputy," three to four car lengths in front of the ambulance. The deputy crying had his face in his hands.

EMT Gallimore exited the ambulance and took the stretcher to the front door of the residence. EMT Gallimore indicated that there was a deputy standing outside of the front door near a "Tupperware" container that was protecting a shell casing. The deputy was standing near the shell casing to protect it from being moved by the emergency personnel going in and out of the residence to render medical aid to Cruice. EMT Gallimore believed the shell casing was from a handgun, even though he had heard from another deputy a "long rifle" was discharged during the shooting incident.

EMT Gallimore entered the residence and observed Cruice lying inside the front door, to the right, in the foyer area, with his feet approximately five to eight feet from the door. Cruice had a gunshot wound to the face. EMT Gallimore asked, and was notified that the gunshot to Cruice was not self-inflicted. The DFR and EVAC Ambulance personnel secured Cruice on a backboard and Cruice was placed into the ambulance to be transported to FHF.

EMT Gallimore said that he closed the doors to the ambulance and was getting ready to leave for the hospital when he asked a deputy (NFI) near the ambulance "what happened? The deputy replied, "He [Cruice] came towards them" from the back hallway to the left of the front door according to EMT Gallimore.

EMT Anglin [Click for Audio](#)

EMT Anglin assisted EMT Gallimore during the response to the incident. EMT Anglin helped to secure Cruice on the backboard and maneuvered the stretcher from the residence to the back

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of the ambulance. EMT Anglin indicated that there was a deputy protecting a piece of "evidence" at the edge of the front porch. A "container" was placed over the evidence and the deputy had his foot on the container to ensure it did not get moved. EMT Anglin said that the "evidence" was not moved when he was moving the stretcher off of the front porch.

EMT Anglin stated that Cruice was lying inside the right side of the doorway, with his feet "no more than five feet" away from the door. Cruice had a gunshot wound to the "right side" of his face according to EMT Anglin. EMT Anglin did not hear any statements made by law enforcement personnel on-scene regarding how Cruice received the gunshot wound. EMT Anglin rode in the back of the ambulance to FHFMM assisting with patient care.

Lieutenant Payne, EMT Gallimore, and EMT Anglin indicated that Cruice did not communicate with them or anyone else when they were providing patient care. They did not see any weapon or object next to Cruice inside the residence when they arrived. Two DFR personnel (NFI) rode in the back of the ambulance to FHFMM with the EVAC Ambulance personnel.

INVESTIGATIVE REPORT

On Wednesday, March 4, 2015, the Volusia County Sheriff's Office (VCSO) requested the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) conduct an investigation into the use of deadly force by VCSO Deputy Todd Raible, which resulted in the death of Derek Cruice. The incident occurred at 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona, Florida, during a narcotics search warrant (VCSO Case #150005942).

On Monday, April 6, 2015, from 1515 to 1535 hours, FDLE Special Agents (SA) Troy Cope and Bill Lee of the Orlando Regional Operations Center conducted a voluntary, sworn, recorded interview of VCSO Sergeant Brodie Hughes. The interview was conducted at Michael H. Lambert's office, attorney for Sergeant Hughes, located at 428 North Halifax Avenue in Daytona Beach, Florida. Sergeant Hughes is a Patrol Sergeant for VCSO District IV and is the Chief Steward (Union President) for the Volusia County Deputies Association. A synopsis of the interview is as follows:

On Wednesday, March 4, 2015, Sergeant Hughes' shift was ending as the Patrol Sergeant in District IV, when he heard a radio transmission regarding a subject "being shot," and "rescue" was requested. Sergeant Hughes responded to the incident scene, located at 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona, Florida, from the Volusia County gas pumps located near State Road 44 and Interstate 4. Sergeant Hughes responded first to assist at the shooting scene, and second as his role of Chief Steward for the Volusia County Deputies Association. Sergeant Hughes was aware that many of the deputies involved were members and may request / need services of the union.

While en route, Sergeant Hughes received a phone call from VCSO Sergeant Jimmie Carlisle who stated to Sergeant Hughes, "I need you here now." Sergeant Hughes arrived at 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona, Florida, within 15 minutes of hearing the initial radio transmission. Upon arrival at approximately 0644 hours, Sergeant Carlisle said to Sergeant Hughes, VCSO Deputy Todd Raible "was really messed up."

Sergeant Hughes walked over to Deputy Raible, who was sitting in a "pick-up truck" one house over from 831 Maybrook, to speak with him. Sergeant Hughes described Deputy Raible as being a "basket case," adding, "probably the worst I've seen." Sergeant Hughes heard several statements from Deputy Raible consisting of, "I can't lose my job," "I can't lose my kids," and "I can't lose my family." Sergeant Hughes stated to Deputy Raible, "You need to settle down, you need to stop talking. You don't need to be making any statements." Sergeant Hughes

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additionally advised Deputy Raible that he needed to decide who he wanted as an attorney.

After speaking briefly with Deputy Raible, Sergeant Hughes indicated that Deputy Raible was able to collect himself. Sergeant Hughes made sure other deputies were around Deputy Raible to "console" him, but stated to everyone, and made it "very clear," "Guys, do not talk about the case." Sergeant Hughes believed most of the individuals around Deputy Raible were from the Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team (DNET).

Sergeant Hughes was notified by Deputy Raible that he wanted attorney Michael H. Lambert to represent him while still at the scene. Sergeant Hughes, along with Teamsters 385 Business Agent Bob Walker worked on getting in contact with Michael H. Lambert and making sure they could get legal representation for the DNET investigators who were witnesses to the shooting incident. Sergeant Hughes remained on-scene until approximately 1000 hours, and then went to the District IV Office, located at 1691 Providence Boulevard in Deltona, Florida, where he remained for the rest of the day.

On Wednesday, March 4, 2015, SA Cope and SA Lee conducted sworn interviews of the VCSO law enforcement witnesses to the shooting incident. SA Cope and SA Lee observed all of the law enforcement witnesses congregated in the conference room of the District IV Office. Sergeant Hughes confirmed that he was there with the witnesses and had instructed them to "not to talk about the facts of the case" while they were together in the conference room.

Sergeant Hughes indicated that he did not cross the crime scene tape surrounding the perimeter of the 831 Maybrook Drive when he was on-scene. Sergeant Hughes did observe Derek Cruice being removed from the residence on a stretcher shortly after he had arrived. Sergeant Hughes said that he did not receive any direct information from Deputy Raible regarding the actions he took or the actions of Cruice during the shooting incident. Sergeant Hughes' radio call sign was "1B40."

On Wednesday, March 4, 2015, the Volusia County Sheriff's Office (VCSO) requested the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) conduct an investigation into the use of deadly force by VCSO Deputy Todd Raible, which resulted in the death of Derek Cruice. The incident occurred at 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona, Florida, during a narcotics search warrant (VCSO Case #150005942).

On Friday, April 10, 2015, from 0917 to 0925 hours, FDLE Special Agents Troy Cope and Bill Lee of the Orlando Regional Operations Center conducted a voluntary, sworn, recorded interview of VCSO Sergeant Justin Stewart. The interview was conducted at Michael H. Lambert's office, attorney for Sergeant Stewart, located at 428 North Halifax Avenue in Daytona Beach, Florida. Sergeant Stewart was a prior member of the Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team (DNET), and responded to the incident location at 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona, Florida. A synopsis of Sergeant Stewart's actions is as follows:

On Wednesday, March 4, 2015, Sergeant Stewart received notification that a deputy had been involved in a shooting in Deltona between 0700 and 0730 hours. Sergeant Stewart was "off-duty" at the time. Sergeant Stewart found out that VCSO Deputy Todd Raible, a member of DNET, had been involved in the shooting, so he headed to incident location at 831 Maybrook Drive.

Sergeant Stewart arrived on scene and was notified by VCSO Sergeant Jimmie Carlisle that Deputy Raible was sitting in a vehicle, described by Sergeant Stewart as a black pick-up truck, separate from "everybody." Sergeant Stewart went to the vehicle and "relieved" VCSO Deputy Austin Raimundo, who was sitting with Deputy Raible. Sergeant Stewart sat with Deputy Raible until he was released from the scene to complete a "urinalysis" test as required by the VCSO.

Sergeant Stewart sat with Deputy Raible for approximately 45 minutes to an hour while at the incident scene. Sergeant Stewart indicated that Deputy Raible was an "emotional mess," but did not make statements or discuss the shooting incident with Sergeant Stewart. Sergeant Stewart did not hear any details of the shooting incident from other DNET members while on-scene.

Macareno said that the tenant changed the deadbolt to the door on their own. Macareno was not sure what the problem was, but knew that it was changed.



The facts tending to establish the grounds for this application and the probable cause of Affiant believing that such facts exist are as follows:

In February 2015, Investigator John Frazzini of the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team received anonymous information regarding narcotics activity occurring at 831 Maybrook Drive, Deltona (the premises). The information provided was that an individual by the name of "Derek Cruice" and his girlfriend "Samantha Sterrett," who reside at the premises, are known to use and sell a variety of illegal narcotics, including cannabis.

Throughout the month of February 2015, members of the Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team conducted undercover activities and surveillance at the premises, including trash analysis and vehicle registration checks. During the trash analysis, suspected cannabis was located within the trash from the premises. During the vehicle registration checks, a blue Suzuki passenger vehicle bearing Florida license plate [REDACTED], which was located parked at the premises, revealed that it was registered to "Derek Andre Cruice."

Based upon this information, Investigator Frazzini prepared a search warrant and affidavit which was presented to and signed by Judge Matthew Foxman, Circuit Court Judge in the 7th Judicial Circuit Court in Volusia County, Florida.

On March 4, 2015, members of the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team arrived at the premises to execute the search warrant. At approximately 06:31 hours, entry was made into the premises by the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team by

forcing the front door open. The members of the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team entered the residence to clear and secure the premises of any occupants located inside the premises. Once inside, deputies located a white male, later identified as Derek Andre Cruice (Date of Birth: 01/26/1989), in the front hallway / foyer of the premises. During a confrontation with Derek Andre Cruice, a deputy with the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team perceived a deadly threat from Derek Andre Cruice, at which time the deputy discharged his firearm in the direction of the perceived threat. Derek Andre Cruice sustained a gunshot wound to the face. Derek Andrea Cruice was transported to Florida Hospital Fish Memorial in Orange City, Florida, where he was pronounced deceased. Because the firearm was discharged inside of the residence, it is highly probable that cartridge casings and other ballistic evidence will be found therein. The acquisition of this evidence will assist FDLE in determining which firearm(s) were discharged, and the location(s) within the house where the discharge occurred.

Your Affiant, Special Agent Stephen A. Brenton, is currently and has been a sworn Special Agent of the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) since July of 2011. Your affiant is currently assigned to the Orlando Regional Operations Center Cyber - Public Integrity Squad.

Prior to your affiant's employment with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, your affiant was employed from November of 2007 thru July of 2011, as an Investigator with the State of Florida Office of the Attorney General Child Predator CyberCrime Unit. During employment your affiant was also cross certified as a Federal Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigations Innocent Images Task Force conducting investigations on a state and federal level, including investigations relating to the sexual abuse and exploitation of children. Prior to that, your affiant was employed with the City of Sunny Isles Beach Police Department in Miami Dade County, Florida from March 1999 thru November 2007. During employment your affiant was assigned to road patrol duties then assigned to the Detective Bureau. During this assignment your affiant was responsible for cases including initiating, assisting and participating in the investigation of street to mid-level criminal/drug activity, general investigative cases, and also sexual battery investigations. Prior to your affiant's employment with the City of Sunny Isles Beach Police Department, your affiant was employed from April of 1994 thru March of 1999, with the Village of Miami Shores Police Department in Miami Dade County, Florida. During employment your affiant was assigned to road patrol duties.



1 On 03-04-15 at 0700, Inv. Dewees was dispatched to this incident by Sgt. P. Thoman. Thoman stated the case was an officer involved shooting.

2 Inv. Dewees responded as the on call crime scene investigator. While enroute, Inv. Dewees was diverted to Florida Hospital Orange City, where

3 the victim was located. Thoman stated the victim had been pronounced dead at the hospital. At 0853, Inv. Dewees arrived at the hospital. Upon

4 arrival Dewees met with FDLE Special Agent Lloyd Randolph. Randolph directed Inv. Dewees to take digital images of the victim and bag his

5 hands for transport. VCSO Inv. Calkins, and VCSO Inv. Weaver were also present at the hospital.

6

7 Inv. Dewees observed the victim in ER treatment room 1. The victim was observed to be a white male, wearing red and black short pants and

8 "Marvel" comics underwear. The victim was wearing a brown colored bead necklace, and had an ear gauge in the left ear lobe. The victim had

9 numerous medical treatment items attached to his body, and he was wearing a neck collar. The victim had what appeared to be a single gunshot

10 wound to the left side of the face, just below the left cheek bone. The victim's hands appeared to be free of injury. No other injuries were

11 observed on the victim's body. The victim's wrist I.D. tag identified the victim as "John Doe". He was later identified as Derek Cruice.

12

13 Inv. Dewees took digital images of the victim's body, followed by the bagging of the victim's hands. Inv. Dewees inquired with Special Agent

14 Randolph about any GSR testing. Randolph stated a GSR test kit was not necessary. Inv. Dewees conducted a visual examination of the back

15 of the victim's head for any possible projectile exit. None was found. Inv. Dewees then donned new examination gloves and felt the back of the

16 victim's head and neck attempting to find any possible projectile exit(s). None were found. It is noted the victim's head area was heavily

17 saturated with blood. At 0948, livery transport arrived at the hospital. John Parrot and Amanda Airing, were the livery attendees. The victim was

18 placed in a body bag which was sealed with an evidence tag. Inv. Dewees took digital images of the sealed body bag and tag. After removal of

19 the victim's body, Inv. Dewees departed the hospital at 1009. Inv. Calkins provided Inv. Dewees with the Crime Scene Log for the hospital

20

21 Inv. Dewees responded to the scene which was located at 831 Maybrook Dr. Deltona. Upon arrival, Inv. Dewees observed the scene to be secure

22 with crime scene tape and posted by VCSO deputies. Inv. Dewees was briefed of the incident by Inv. Don Maxwell. Maxwell stated VCSO

23 investigators were serving a narcotics search warrant at the residence and performed a forced entry at the front door. Inv. Todd Raible made

24 entry to the house and was confronted by the victim in a threatening manner. Maxwell stated Raible apparently fired a single shot from his

25 department issued firearm which struck the victim in the face. Maxwell stated to his knowledge, Inv. Raible only fired one shot. After speaking

26 with Maxwell, Inv. Dewees spoke with FDLE Special Agent Daniel Warren. Warren advised Inv. Dewees a search warrant for the premises was

27 being obtained due to the shooting incident. Warren requested Dewees take digital images of Inv. Raible's firearm and document the number of

28 cartridges in the weapon magazine, and the spare magazine.

29

30 After speaking with Warren, Dewees made contact with Sgt. Sawicki of VCSO Internal Affairs. At 1045, Sawicki presented Inv. Dewees with Inv.

31 Raible's .40 caliber Glock pistol and his spare magazine. Sgt. Sawicki had the pistol and spare magazine secured in a Glock pistol box. Inv.

32 Dewees examined the pistol in the presence of FDLE Special Agent Danielle Gill. The pistol is identified as a Glock Model 35, .40 caliber pistol,

33 SN: GAD640. The pistol had an attached weapon light and laser combination. Inv. Dewees ejected the magazine from the pistol. The pistol

34 magazine contained 14 rounds (magazine capacity 15) of issued .40 caliber Speer JHP ammunition. The ammunition from the pistol magazine

35 was documented as 1-14. A single .40 caliber Speer JHP round was recovered from the pistol chamber. This round was identified as "C". Inv.

36 Dewees took digital images of the pistol, pistol magazine, and ammunition. The spare magazine was then examined. The spare magazine was


37 found to be loaded with 12 rounds of issued .40 caliber Speer JHP ammunition. The spare magazine has a capacity of 15 rounds. The

38 ammunition from the spare magazine was documented as 1-12. Inv. Dewees took digital images of the spare magazine and ammunition. After

39 examination of the firearm and ammunition, Inv. Dewees maintained custody.

41 Inv. Dewees asked Sgt. Sawicki about the holster and or belt worn by Inv. Raible. Sawicki stated that Raible was wearing a drop holster and only

42 had the one spare magazine. Sawicki stated the holster was returned to Inv. Raible. At the time Inv. Dewees arrived, Inv. Raible had been

43 removed from the scene. Inv. Dewees spoke with Inv. Maxwell to assure digital images were taken of Inv. Raible. During the course of the

44 investigation at the scene, Inv. Dewees was shadowed by Dep. Jason Turner and Dep. Amanda Gallagher. Both deputies are in training as crime

45 scene investigators. Dep. Turner assisted Inv. Dewees with measurements of the scene, and collected presumptive blood samples under the

46 supervision of Inv. Dewees. Dep. Gallagher assisted Inv. Dewees with measurements of the scene.

47

48 Prior to the arrival of the search warrant, Special Agent Daniel Warren requested that two VCSO patrol cars be documented so they could be

49 removed from the scene. Inv. Dewees took digital images of vehicle number 178608 which was parked on Maybrook Dr. at the edge of the

50 driveway of 831. Vehicle number 191298 was parked further west on Maybrook Dr. in front of 839. Inv. Dewees took digital images of this

51 vehicle. A rough sketch was completed showing the vehicle locations in relation to the scene. Inv. Dewees observed the following vehicles on the

52 property of 831 Maybrook Dr. A blue Suzuki car (FL. tag DMW-R88) was parked at the east side of the residence. A brown Geo Prizm (FL. tag

53 [REDACTED]) was parked in the yard east of the driveway. This vehicle had the headlights on. A white Mitsubishi Endeavor (FL. tag [REDACTED]) was

54 parked in the driveway on the east side. A gray Chevrolet Impala (FL. tag [REDACTED]) was parked on the west side of the driveway.

55

56 At 1259, the search warrant was executed on the premises by FDLE Special Agent Steve Brent. During the course of this investigation, FDLE

57 Special Agent Lloyd Randolph oversaw the duties of the Crime Scene Unit. Inv. Dewees took digital video and images of the premises exterior

58 and interior. A walk-through of the scene revealed the following items of evidence. Inv. Dewees observed the outside front porch light to be on. A

59 single .40 caliber Speer shell case was found on the front porch. This shell case was covered with a Tupperware type container to prevent it from

60 blowing around from the wind. A Halligan tool was located on the front porch against the east wall. A battering ram was located on the ground in

61 close proximity to the front porch. The threshold to the front door exhibited presumptive blood droplets consistent with 90 degrees of angle.

62

63 The front door exhibited shoe prints in dirt on the exterior door face. There appeared to be two shoe prints which overlapped. Examination of the

64 door did not reveal any evidence of being struck by a ram. The door possessed a single key deadbolt lock. The exterior door had a decorative

65 handleset with a thumb piece release. Upon Inv. Dewees trying to open the door from the outside, the thumb piece was able to be depressed, but

66 the door did not open. It was found that the door was hanging up from possible friction between the door frame and door. Force had to be applied

67 to the door to open. Inspection of the door and door frame showed paint abrasion at the top of the door and on the adjacent door frame. Further

68 testing showed the door would intermittently hang up.

69

70 The door frame striker plates for the door bolt (for handleset and knob) and deadbolt were both intact. The lack of damage to the deadbolt plate

71 would indicate the deadbolt was not locked when the door was breached. Examination of the side of the door showed vertical cracks adjacent to

72 the door bolt face (for handleset and knob), this would be consistent with the door bolt being engaged in the striker plate when the door was

73 breached. The interior side of the door had a non-locking door knob and a standard thumbturn for the deadbolt lock. Inv. Dewees and Special

74 Agent Randolph checked the deadbolt which appeared to function normally. The interior knob also appeared to function normally.

75

76 The foyer floor inside the front door was covered with a 63"x 80" area rug. This rug exhibited presumptive blood droplets. The first observed

77 droplets on the carpet were approximately 50" (south) from the front doorway. Additional droplets led further south-southwest from the doorway

78 towards the south wall in the foyer. Four dairy crates were found against this wall and appeared to be used for shoe storage. A large pool of

79 blood measuring approximately 4'x4' was located at the west corner of the south foyer wall. This blood pool contained three socks and gauze

80 pads. This blood contained both liquid and coagulated blood. Blood was found on the face of the south foyer wall at the west corner. This blood

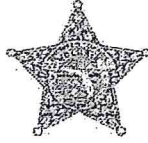

81 extended to approximately 10" height. On the living room side of the corner (east) blood was found to extend to approximately 14" height. The
 82 blood on both walls appear consistent with the source (victim) being on the floor at the corner. A white table was located on the east wall of the
 83 living room. This table was adjacent to the blood pool on the floor. A bloody hand print was located on the north end of the table. Several
 84 droplets of blood were located on the floor of the living room beside the chase lounge.
 85
 86 Inv. Dewees was asked by FDLE to document the white horizontal blinds in the living room. The blinds on the west side window were retracted
 87 completely up. The blinds on the east side were louvered open at 90 degrees. Inv. Dewees took digital images of the blinds. The blind cords
 88 were found to function normally. Continued examination of the scene revealed presumptive marijuana in the southeast bedroom, this was located
 89 in a plastic bag on a foot stool at the end of the bed. A fix bladed knife in a sheath was located on the floor beside the bed. A folding knife was
 90 located on the armrest of the sofa in the southwest bedroom. A search of the living room did not reveal any weapons near the front door area. A
 91 butter knife was located on the white table on the east wall of the living room. Further search of the residence did not reveal any evidence related
 92 to the shooting incident. Inv. Dewees completed a rough sketch of the scene to include measurements. FDLE requested a specific measurement
 93 from the threshold of the southwest bedroom to the front door. This measurement was recorded as 27'. All evidence was identified by photo I.D.
 94 numbers or scales. Digital images were then taken of all the evidence. All evidence was collected and listed on Inv. Dewees' six page property
 95 supplement report Processing of the scene was completed at 1821.
 96
 97 On 03-05-15 at 0900 the autopsy of the victim was conducted by Dr. Chiste of the Medical Examiner's Office. The victim was found to have a
 98 single gunshot wound to the left side of the face below the cheek. The projectile was recovered from the victim's left shoulder. Dr. Chiste stated
 99 that the projectile struck an artery in the victim's neck, which proved fatal. Dr. Chiste found no evidence of powder stippling on the victim's face
 100 and she concluded the shot was at least two feet away when fired. The autopsy was concluded at 1145. Inv. Dewees took custody of the autopsy
 101 evidence. This evidence is listed on Inv. Dewees' six page property supplement report. On 03-05-15, Inv. Dewees completed a Firearms
 102 Recognition Report on the Glock pistol recovered from Inv. Raible. Inv. Dewees noted in the report that no blood was found on the Glock pistol
 103 upon visual inspection. The light and laser attached to the Glock pistol were found to be fully functional.
 104
 105 On 03-06-15 at 1100, all evidence in this case was released to FDLE Special Agent Troy Cope. Inv. Dewees uploaded all digital images to VCSO
 106 Digital Crime Scene server. A DVD containing the digital video of the scene was remanded to VCSO Evidence for safekeeping. Copies of all
 107 reports and sketches by Inv. Dewees will be provided to FDLE, VCSO Internal Affairs, and VCSO Inv. Maxwell.

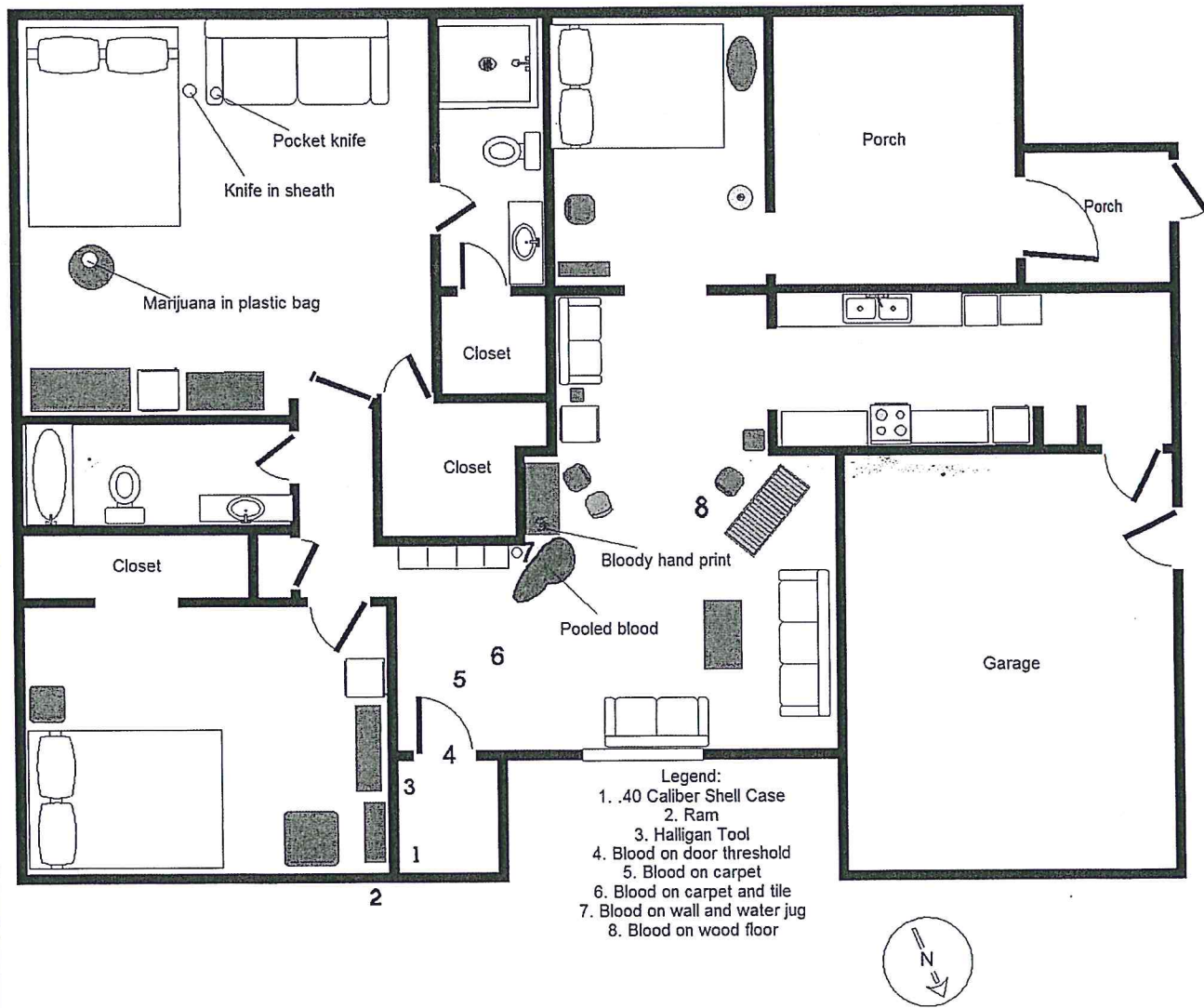

INVESTIGATIVE REPORT

On Wednesday, March 4, 2015, the Volusia County Sheriff's Office (VCSO) requested the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) conduct an investigation into the use of deadly force by VCSO Deputy Todd Raible, which resulted in the death of Derek Cruice. The incident occurred at 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona, Florida, during a narcotics search warrant (VCSO Case #150005942).

On Friday, March 6, 2015, FDLE Special Agent (SA) Steve Brenton of the Orlando Regional Operations Center obtained a search warrant for 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona, Florida. The purpose of the search warrant was to obtain the front door of the residence as evidence. The search warrant was signed by the Honorable Matthew M. Foxman, Circuit Judge for the Seventh Judicial Circuit. After the search warrant was signed and served at 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona, Florida, VCSO Crime Scene Investigator Richard Graves assisted with the processing and collection of the front door, and documented the activities under VCSO Case #150005942.

During the collection of the evidence, SA Cope directed Investigator Graves to photograph the entryway and outside illumination based on descriptions provided by statements SA Cope obtained of witnesses on Wednesday, March 4, 2015. On Tuesday, April 21, 2015, at approximately 1400 hours, Investigator Graves provided the crime scene report and digital images to FDLE SA Troy Cope at the VCSO District III office, located at 1435 U.S. Highway 1, Suite D-3, in Ormond Beach, Florida.

A video was taken by Investigator Graves related to the functionality of the door on Friday, March, 6, 2015, at the direction of SA Cope, prior to the doors removal from its hinges. The video showed how the door's handle and latch operated on the outside of the residence as well as the door knob on the inside of the residence. The video also demonstrates how far the door opens into the residence. The video was provided to SA Cope on Wednesday, April 22, 2015, at approximately 1445 hours, by Investigator Graves at the VCSO District III office.

The search warrant and crime scene report will be maintained electronically in the related items section of the case file, labeled INV-53 and INV-54, respectively. DVD-R discs containing the crime scene photographs and crime scene video will be maintained in the related items section of the case file, labeled INV-55 and INV-56, respectively.

That there is now a violation of Chapter 784, Florida Statutes, relating to the Homicide located on the aforesaid property and being contrary to such statute, and is being kept therein:

There is now being kept on said premises, the following described property:

- Door and hinges for the front main entrance to the premises.

Which said property is believed to be located on the above said premises.

The facts tending to establish the grounds for this application and the probable cause of Affiant believing that such facts exist are as follows:

In February 2015, Investigator John Frazzini of the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team received anonymous information regarding narcotics activity occurring at 831 Maybrook Drive, Deltona (the premises). The information provided was that an individual by the name of "Derek Cruice" and his girlfriend "Samantha Sterrett," who reside at the premises, are known to use and sell a variety of illegal narcotics, including cannabis.

Throughout the month of February 2015, members of the Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team conducted undercover activities and surveillance at the premises, including trash analysis and vehicle registration checks. During the trash analysis, suspected cannabis was located within the trash from the premises. During the vehicle registration checks, a blue Suzuki passenger vehicle bearing Florida license plate [REDACTED], which was located parked at the premises, revealed that it was registered to "Derek Andre Cruice."

Based upon this information, Investigator Frazzini prepared a search warrant and affidavit which was presented to and signed by Judge Matthew Foxman, Circuit Court Judge in the 7th Judicial Circuit Court in Volusia County, Florida.

On March 4, 2015, members of the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team arrived at the premises to execute the search warrant. At approximately 06:31 hours, entry was made into the premises by the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team by forcing the front door open. The members of the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team entered the residence to clear and secure the premises of any occupants located inside the premises. Once inside, deputies located a white male, later identified as Derek Andre Cruice (Date of

Birth: 01/26/1989), in the front hallway / foyer of the premises. During a confrontation with Derek Andre Cruice, a deputy with the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Deltona Narcotics Enforcement Team perceived a deadly threat from Derek Andre Cruice, at which time the deputy discharged his firearm in the direction of the perceived threat. Derek Andre Cruice sustained a gunshot wound to the face. Derek Andrea Cruice was transported to Florida Hospital Fish Memorial in Orange City, Florida, where he was pronounced deceased.

Your Affiant did secure and execute a search warrant to for the purpose of collecting evidence relating to this incident on March 4, 2015, and did collect said evidence. As a result of the evidence collected, and the testimony of witnesses to the incident, your Affiant believes that an additional item of evidence needs to be collected to further continue with the investigation of this case. After completely reviewing the testimony of the witnesses, it was discovered that the front door of the premises was originally opened by an occupant at the time that the original narcotics search warrant was executed. At the time that the occupant was taken outside of the residence, the occupant closed the front door behind him. Testimony of the witnesses revealed that it was believed by the deputies executing the search warrant that either the occupant locked the door upon his exit, or that someone inside of the residence locked the door. Eventually the forced entry of the door was done, and the shooting occurred very shortly thereafter. Your Affiant believes that it is necessary to take possession of the door and hinges for the front main entrance to the premises in order to conduct further forensic analysis of the door.

Your Affiant, Special Agent Stephen A. Brenton, is currently and has been a sworn Special Agent of the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) since July of 2011. Your affiant is currently assigned to the Orlando Regional Operations Center Cyber - Public Integrity Squad.

Prior to your affiant 's employment with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, your affiant was employed from November of 2007 thru July of 2011, as an Investigator with the State of Florida Office of the Attorney General Child Predator CyberCrime Unit. During employment your affiant was also cross certified as a Federal Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigations Innocent Images Task Force conducting investigations on a state and federal level, including investigations relating to the sexual abuse and exploitation of children. Prior to that, your affiant was employed with the City of Sunny Isles Beach Police Department in Miami Dade County, Florida from March 1999 thru November 2007. During employment your affiant was assigned to road patrol duties then assigned to the Detective Bureau. During this assignment your affiant was responsible for cases including initiating, assisting and participating in the investigation of street to mid-level criminal/drug activity, general investigative cases,

On Monday, May 25, 2015, SA Cope conducted a voluntary, sworn, recorded interview of VCSO Deputy Cody Cochran. The interview was conducted from 1028 to 1032 hours at the VCSO District IV Substation, located at 1691 Providence Boulevard in Deltona, Florida. Also present during the interview was VCSO Sergeant Brodie Hughes, Chief Steward of the Volusia County Deputies Association. A synopsis of the interview is as follows:

Deputy Cochran indicated that during the incident on Wednesday, March 4, 2015, at 831 Maybrook Drive in Deltona, Florida, he did not have in his possession a body camera, nor did he have any audio-recording device activated during the shooting incident. Deputy Cochran stated that the VCSO District IV Street Crimes Unit is not issued body cameras. Deputy Cochran is unaware of any other individuals who were present during the shooting incident that had either a body camera or audio-recording device in their possession or activated during the incident.

SA Cope showed Deputy Cochran the photographs taken of him on Wednesday, March 4, 2015, and confirmed that this is how Deputy Cochran was dressed during the incident. The photographs show that Deputy Cochran was equipped with a microphone for his radio that was positioned on top of Deputy Cochran's left shoulder. There is a wire that comes down from the microphone that plugs into Deputy Cochran's radio, positioned on Deputy Cochran's left side of his vest. The photographs were signed and dated by Deputy Cochran.
