#### **BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION:**

On June 1, 2021, deputies responded to a report of two missing juveniles, Nicole Jackson and Travis O'Brien, from the Florida Methodist Children's Home, located at 51 Main Street, Enterprise. The deputies conducted a search for the two juveniles, and spotted them on several occasions to which the juveniles fled on foot away from deputies.

Approximately an hour later, deputies were alerted to a possible burglary-in-progress at 1050 Enterprise Osteen Road, Enterprise, which was in the general area where deputies last saw the two juveniles. Deputies responded to the residence and observed the two runaway juveniles within the residence damaging the interior and breaking windows.

As deputies converged on the residence to establish a perimeter and contact the two juveniles, several gunshots were fired from the interior of the residence towards deputies' positions. Deputies maintained their positions of cover and gave numerous orders for the two juveniles to exit the residence and surrender.

A short time later, Jackson and O'Brien exited the residence into an open attached garage, where deputies observed Jackson armed with a shotgun, and O'Brien armed with an AK-47 rifle. Jackson exited the garage, pointed the shotgun at deputies, and fired at least one round from the shotgun. Jackson's actions caused Sergeants Omar Bello and William Maxwell, Deputies Donald Gray, Anthony Ray, Nichole Richardson, Michael Sawicki, Anthony Zimmerer, and Detective David Winhoven to fire their weapons at Jackson, striking her multiple times. Jackson sustained serious injuries because of the deputies' response to resistance.

O'Brien surrendered a few moments later, unharmed, at which time deputies began life-saving initial treatment of Jackson's injuries. Jackson was transported to Central Florida Regional Medical Center for further evaluation and treatment.

It should be noted, a 12-gauge shotgun and a .22 caliber handgun was recovered from Jackson's person upon making contact with her to provide medical care.

The Volusia Sheriff's Office Crime Scene Unit processed the scene, while Special Agent Scott Ratliff, with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE), conducted the criminal investigation into the use of deadly force. The completed FDLE Investigative Summary is documented under FDLE case # OR-27-0395.

Both Jackson and O'Brien were arrested and charged with Attempted First Degree Murder (LEO), Armed Burglary – Dwelling/Structure/Conveyance, and Criminal Mischief (over \$1,000).

Due to the nature of the incident, Chief Deputy J. Gallagher initiated an internal affairs investigation

#### **INVESTIGATION:**

On June 1, 2021, the above listed deputies were involved in a deputy involved shooting at 1050 Enterprise Osteen Road, Enterprise.

On the same date, Chief Deputy J. Gallagher assigned the above-described incident to the Internal Affairs Unit for investigation, and the involved deputies were placed on administrative leave with pay. Additionally, the aforementioned deputies submitted to a drug urinalysis screening immediately after the incident. The results of the drug screenings were negative.

Lieutenant Shivers also notified the deputies, through official correspondence, regarding the tolling of the internal investigation until the completion of FDLE's criminal investigation.

On June 10, 2021, all of the involved deputies were evaluated in a fitness for duty examination, conducted by Dr. Gregory Landrum, Psy. D., DABPS. All eight deputies were determined to be fit to return to duty without restriction.

On September 21, 2021, Lieutenant Shivers obtained the firearms qualification records for the involved deputies through VSO Training Section. Lieutenant Shivers observed the following –

Sergeant Omar Bello successfully requalified in the use of his agency issued Troy rifle as per the Volusia Sheriff's Office General Orders on April 28, 2021.

Sergeant William Maxwell successfully requalified in the use of his agency issued Glock 34 pistol as per the Volusia Sheriff's Office General Orders on January 4, 2021.

Detective David Winhoven successfully requalified in the use of his agency issued Troy rifle as per the Volusia Sheriff's Office General Orders on April 28, 2021.

Deputy Donald Gray successfully requalified in the use of his agency issued Colt rifle as per the Volusia Sheriff's Office General Orders on January 21, 2021.

Deputy Nicole Richardson successfully requalified in the use of his agency issued Glock 34 pistol as per the Volusia Sheriff's Office General Orders on January 15, 2021.

Deputy Anthony Ray successfully requalified in the use of his agency issued Colt rifle as per the Volusia Sheriff's Office General Orders on April 28, 2021.

Deputy Michael Sawicki successfully requalified in the use of his agency issued Colt rifle as per the Volusia Sheriff's Office General Orders on April 28, 2021.

Deputy Anthony Zimmerer successfully requalified in the use of his agency issued Glock 34 pistol as per the Volusia Sheriff's Office General Orders on January 11, 2021.

At the completion of his investigation, Special Agent Scott Ratliff delivered his completed FDLE Investigative Summary, along with a complete copy of the related police use of force case file, to the Volusia Sheriff's Office Internal Affairs Unit. This comprehensive case file (OR-27-0395) concluded, stating the following –

"The Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) has completed a comprehensive investigation in the use of force by Volusia Sheriff's Office employees Deputy Nicole Richardson, Deputy Michael Sawicki, Deputy Donald Gray, Deputy Anthony Zimmerer, Sergeant William

Maxwell, Sergeant Omar Bello, and Detective David Winhoven. This presentation of facts is based on law enforcement witnesses, civilian witnesses, and physical evidence. FDLE submits this investigative summary to the Office of the State Attorney for their review and disposition."

On September 15, 2021, Sheriff Chitwood received a letter from State Attorney R.J. Larizza regarding the Office of the State Attorney's review of the deputies' use of force on June 1, 2021. State Attorney Larizza wrote:

"Dear Special Agent Ratliff,

This letter is to advise that this office has reviewed all of the investigative reports, officer statements and witness statements provided by your office regarding the "police use of force" involving Deputy Nicole Richardson, Deputy Michael Sawicki, Deputy Donald Gray, Deputy Anthony Zimmerer, Deputy Anthony Ray, Sgt. William Maxwell, Sgt. Omar Bello and Det. David Winhoven of the Volusia County Sheriff's Office that occurred on June 1, 2021.

Based on a review of the investigation and the information provided, no further action is warranted by this office."

#### **CONCLUSION:**

On September 17, 2021, this investigation was presented to the Sheriff and his administrative staff. After review, the Sheriff, and his staff, determined the use of deadly force was **JUSTIFIED** to prevent imminent death or great bodily harm to the deputies, and found no violations of policy.
