As a General Magistrate I preside over various family law matters in St. Johns and Flagler Counties. The types of cases I hear include motions for temporary relief, uncontested dissolutions of marriage, modifications, contempt/enforcement actions, and name changes. I also manage a dependency docket in Flagler County consisting of arraignments, pre-trials, and

judicial reviews. My role as a quasi-judicial officer is to listen to the testimony, review the evidence, and then issue a written report applying the law to the evidence that was presented. All parties, regardless of whether they have representation, should be treated with respect and provided an opportunity to be heard.

During my employment with the Department of Children and Families and the State Attorney's Office in Pasco County, I represented the Department and its contracted agencies in dependency and termination of parental rights proceedings.

I was employed in private practice for two years as a legal service provider for the Department of Revenue and handled Title IV-D child support cases. We represented the Department of Revenue in establishing, modifying and enforcing child support obligations.

As an Assistant State Attorney in Duval County, I prosecuted misdemeanors, felonies, and juvenile cases for five years.

a. <u>Department of Revenue v. James Cummings, et. al,</u> 930 So. 2d 604 (Fla. 2006) Co-counsel: Myron J. Mensh, Esquire and the Attorney General's Office

I was employed as a legal service provider for the Department of Revenue with the law firm of Mensh and MacIntosh, P.A. This case was the result of several appeals from the trial court addressing the issue of whether a legal father is an indispensable party to a support proceeding against the putative/biological father. I handled several of these cases at the trial level, and worked closely with the Attorney General's office on the appeals. The resulting decision by the Florida Supreme Court has provided direction for cases throughout the state and protected the interests of the children entitled to support.

b. J.M., Mother of L.T., D.T., and K.T., Children v. Department of Children and Families, 947 So. 2d 1186 (Fla. 5th DCA 2007)

Presiding Judge: Honorable John M. Alexander

Co-counsel: Jennifer White

Opposing Counsel: Michael L. Edwards

I represented the Department of Children and Families in a dependency matter wherein the child allegedly committed suicide. The Department sheltered the deceased child's siblings pursuant to allegations of abuse primarily by the stepfather. A possible law enforcement theory regarding the case was that the stepfather inflicted so much psychological abuse upon the children that he was in fact at fault for the child's death. This case was challenging due to the difficulties in proving mental abuse, as well as due to the mother's decision to remain with the stepfather even though the Court refused to reunify the children with her under those circumstances.

c. <u>In the Interests of S.M.</u> (St. Johns County dependency matter)

Presiding Judge: Honorable John M. Alexander

I represented the Department of Children and Families in a termination of parental rights proceeding. This case had a number of challenges, beginning with the fact that the child had been removed from her parents several times over the course of approximately 3-4 years. The mother had substantially completed her case plan; however, the Department could not guarantee the child could safety return to her home because of the risk of potential abuse. Each time the child was returned in the past, the mother then placed the child at risk again from domestic violence, hazardous living conditions, substance abuse, or mental health issues. After the Department filed a petition to terminate parental rights, former foster parents then filed an intervening petition to adopt. As there had been allegations of abuse by the foster parent, the Department then challenged the fitness of the potential adoptive family. The Department eventually prevailed on their petition for termination, defeated the intervening petition to adopt, and the child was committed to the Department for adoption.

d. R.C., Father of R.C., J.G., P.G., S.G., Etc. v. Department of Children and Families, 917

So. 2d 241 (Fla. 5th DCA 2005)

Presiding Judge: Honorable John M. Alexander

Opposing Counsel: R. Mitchell Prugh

I represented the Department of Children and Families in a dependency matter wherein the six children (all of whom had developmental delays) were removed after the family, while fleeing an open abuse investigation, was involved in a fatal vehicle crash. One of the children was killed during the accident, and S.G. was critically injured. S.G. was in a coma for months, made significant efforts at recovery, but died several years later. An adult sibling accepted the challenge of caring for her younger siblings. The Department learned that the father had sexually abused several of the daughters prior to removal. During a motion to prohibit the father from having contact with the children until he

completed a psychosexual evaluation and necessary treatment, the Department presented child hearsay evidence in order to protect the developmentally delayed victims from having to testify. One of the victims who was unable to testify was the daughter who was still in a coma. The father appealed and the case was reversed as to the child hearsay testimony.

e. State v. M.K.

Opposing counsel: Ray David

I prosecuted M.K. for a charge of driving under the influence. Unlike the majority of such cases, the vehicle M.K. was operating was not moving. This was a case in which the crime was being in actual, physical control of a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol. M.K. had pulled over to the side of the road and placed his vehicle in park but failed to turn off the engine before passing out. After seeing photographs taken by law enforcement of M.K. sleeping against the steering wheel while the dashboard showed indications that the engine was running, the jury returned a guilty verdict.

- (iv) descriptions of the five most significant cases you have tried or heard, identifying the citation or style, attorneys involved, dates of the case, and the reason you believe these cases to be significant.
 - a. T.L.B. v. P.J.B., Sr., St. Johns County DR10-0614; Hearing held March 17, 2011
 - i. The Former Wife represented herself. The Former Husband was represented by Christopher Adamec.
 - ii. The parties were divorced in May 2010 and neither party had counsel for the underlying dissolution proceeding. Four children were born during the marriage. The Former Wife's original petition alleged that the third child was not common to the parties, but the parties entered into a Marital Settlement Agreement which identified all four minor children as the parties' children.
 - iii. The Former Husband filed a petition to disestablish paternity of the youngest child when he was nine years old and introduced DNA results showing a 0% probability of paternity. The Former Wife opposed the petition and presented evidence that the Former Husband had always known that he was not the biological father yet had continued to act as the father. The Former Wife testified she disclosed to the Former Husband when she was pregnant with the child that someone else may be the father, but the parties agreed to raise the child as their own.
 - iv. After hearing I found that the Former Husband knew he was not the biological father prior to entry of the Final Judgment, had signed two sworn statements acknowledging paternity, voluntarily promised in writing to support the child, and consented to be named on the child's birth certificate. The petition to disestablish paternity was denied due to

- the Former Husband failing to satisfy the requirements of Section 742.18, Florida Statutes.
- b. J.J.M. v. K.S.M., St. Johns County Case DR12-1103; Hearings held August 15 and 16, 2012 and May 22, 2013
 - i. The Husband was represented by Carol Caldwell and the Wife was represented by Brandon Beardsley.
 - ii. The parties' minor child was two years old at the time of the hearing. The case was referred to me for temporary matters.
 - iii. After consideration of the testimony and application of the relevant factors within Section 61.13, Florida Statutes, I found it was in the child's best interest for the Husband to have temporary majority timesharing and for the Wife to submit to a psychological evaluation due to the evidence which raised concerns about her mental stability. A Final Judgment was subsequently entered with similar recommendations for timesharing.
 - iv. The significance of this case is that the Wife had engaged in behaviors designed to thwart and manipulate the orders of the Court, including having her paramour slash the tires of opposing counsel. The Wife produced a website with derogatory information about the Circuit Judge and other individuals. This case demonstrates the volatility of family law cases and the unpredictability of a litigant's behavior.
- c. C.G.G. v. D.M.G., St. Johns County Case DR06-1137; Hearings held April 8, 2010, November 27, 2012, February 26, 2013, June 4, 2013, September 19, 2013, October 3, 2013, October 17, 2013, February 6, 2014, and February 9, 2016.
 - i. The Former Husband was represented by Mina Bustamante, Suzanne Green, Jody Greene, and Alan Henderson. The Former Wife was represented by Michael Edwards and Beth Luna.
 - ii. The parties were divorced in 2007 and had three minor children in common.
 - iii. The parties were engaged in litigation for several years following the divorce and the Court was compelled to micromanage much of their children's lives, including their participation in extra-curricular activities.
 - iv. This case illustrates the damage that can be caused to the children during lengthy litigation in family law.
- d. F.W. v. K.W., St. Johns County Case DR16-1057; Hearing held February 5, 2019
 - i. The Former Wife was represented by John Westfield; The Former Husband was pro se.
 - ii. The Former Wife was seeking to compel the Former Husband to sign necessary documents for her to get passports for the children and to travel to the Sudan where she was born. The Former Husband objected because he felt it was not safe for the Former Wife to travel with the children to that region.
 - iii. The significance in this case were the travel advisories from the U.S. State Department warning that individuals reconsider travel to that area "due to

terrorism and civil unrest." The State Department recommended that persons travelling there establish protocols in the event they are kidnapped and leave DNA samples for potential identification. The Former Wife's request to compel the Former Husband to consent to the travel was denied.

- e. M.F. v. A.D.P., St. Johns County Case DR16-0961, Hearing held March 1, 2017
 - i. The Wife was represented by Lawrence C. Datz, and the Husband was represented by Lauren Kingry.
 - ii. It is noted that the parties have continued to engage in extensive litigation and there are currently almost 800 filings. Both parties have changed counsel several times.
 - iii. The case was first before me for temporary needs. The determination of financial matters was difficult due to the parties operating a business and regularly receiving money from family members in another country. Additionally, one party had begun a business post-separation that was in direct competition with the parties' marital business. This case illustrates the challenges facing the Court during a dissolution of marriage when the parties jointly operate a business.

M. v. M., St. Johns County DR12-0819

The matter came before me on contempt and a supplemental petition for modification of child support and alimony. I found that the Former Husband's termination from his employment due to his alcoholism and failure to report to work was a voluntary circumstance. The trial court remanded the matter to me for further findings and I issued a supplemental report recognizing the authority of *Hass v. Hass*, 552 So. 2d 252 (Fla. 4th DCA 1989) and amending my recommendations accordingly.

Martin v. Robbins, 194 So. 3d 563 (Fla. 5th DCA 2016)

The matter came before me upon the Former Husband's request to modify alimony. I found that the Former Wife's romantic relationship had ended and therefore there was not a supportive relationship. The case was remanded on appeal and the Former Husband was afforded a credit towards alimony for the time period within which the supportive relationship existed.

My quasi-judicial experience has uniquely prepared me to become a member of the Judiciary. I have spent over 14 years listening to evidence, applying the law to the facts, and reducing my findings and conclusions to writing.
