1. Poole v. Poole, 05-2017-DR-28026, Final Judgment entered 3/19/19. I represented the Respondent, Audrey Brooke Poole, the Wife in a dissolution of marriage action, tried before General Magistrate Leslie Castaldi on 2/12/18, against opposing counsel, Tino Gonzalez, Esquire. I found this case significant because my client sought supervised time sharing for her Husband, due to alcohol addiction concerns. Since the Wife's burden was so significant, I thought the case was significant in my obligation to put all the evidence together and present the case in a manner that the Court would consider Ms. Poole's request seriously.

2. Butler v. Hood, 05-2015-DR-13075, Final Judgment entered on 6/20/18. I represented the Respondent, Rhonda Hood, in a Paternity/Time Sharing case, tried before Judge Jennifer Taylor on 3/17/18 and 5/10/18, against opposing counsel, Samuel Henderson, Esquire. I found this case significant because I came onto the case late, and the Court appointed a Guardian Ad Litem. It was challenging to present my client's case, which was in opposition to the GAL's recommendation.

3. Wayne and Wendy Lovett v. Charles Pescatore, 05-2017-DR-32204, dismissed on 7/18/18. I represented the Petitioners, in a grandparents' visitation case, before Judge Christine Serrano, against opposing counsel, Melissa Peat, Esquire. This case was significant because it involved grandparents' visitation rights in a situation where the Petitioners' daughter (the Mother of the infant) died in child birth, and Mr. Pescatore (the Father of the child) was in a rehab facility. I felt we did great work just surviving the Father's Motion to Dismiss (on constitutional grounds), to go before the Court for a hearing on visitation. There were novel, complex and interesting constitutional issues involved in the case.

4. In the Matter of Jayce C. Malafis, 05-2017-GA-16988, and 05-2017-GA-16988, twin cases involving guardianship of a minor, before Judge Lisa Davidson, against opposing counsel, David Wolfman, Esquire. This was such a tragic and difficult case, involving my clients (the young child's paternal uncle and his wife) against the child's maternal grandfather. Both natural parents committed suicide, and the involved parties were fighting for guardianship rights to the child. This case was significant for me since it involved areas of law that I'm somewhat unfamiliar with, there were witnesses and evidence scattered throughout the southeastern United States, and there was a real need to be sensitive to the loss that all parties involved experienced, and how that loss motivated the ongoing litigation.

5. Stevenson v. Stevenson, 05-2009-DR-44418, a dissolution of marriage action, tried before Judge Lisa Davidson on 1/23/12, against opposing counsel Shari Wilson, Esquire. I represented the Husband/Father, Gregory Stevenson, in the matter. This

divorce case involved significant litigation during the time the case remained pending, including lengthy litigation in related injunction cases filed by the Wife against the Husband. The case also involved complicated relocation issues, as well as issues related to opposing counsel's efforts to recuse the Judge.

6. Whitson v. Whitson, 05-2018-DR-5222, a dissolution of marriage action, before Magistrate Leslie Castaldi, against opposing counsel, Lindsey Sharp, Esquire. This case was a very involved time sharing case. I represented the Husband/Petitioner, Mel Whitson. The parties resolved alimony and property distribution issues at mediation, but litigated time sharing issues over a two-day trial. This case was significant/interesting because a Guardian Ad Litem was appointed and was recommending the Wife's requested Parenting Plan. I found it challenging to examine the Guardian in a manner in which I attempted to professionally discredit the Guardian's findings.

In conclusion, I've been practicing a very long time, and I've represented numerous clients. I'm sure there are many cases that might be "more significant" than the comparatively recent ones I indicated above, but I don't have records that go back that far to jog my memory.






