On Saturday August 23rd 2014 at approximately 11:50 AM while on patrol I was traveling WB on SR-400 from MM109 in a marked Florida Highway Patrol unit.. As I traveled WB I observed a white box truck with NC tag with no stop lamps and no turn signals. I conducted a traffic stop at MM106 WB on SR-400. When I first activated my emergency equipment the driver did not stop, I then started to drive up to the drivers window when the driver saw me started to pull over. When the vehicle started to pull over I verified that both stop lamps were not working and a turn signal was not working either. I then exited my patrol vehicle and went up to make contact with the driver. I approached on the right side of the truck and immediately upon opening the passenger side door to speak to the occupants a strong odor of raw marijuana emitted from the cab of the truck. I made contact with the occupants, the driver a Mr. Mark Anthony McDonald II DOB 3-3-1986, and the co-driver Mr. Elliott Christopher Mattocks II DOB 9-2-1983. Mr. McDonald stated he did not have his NC license with him but it was good he stated. I called for back up and Trooper. Terrell showed up to back me up. When Trooper Terrell walked up to the truck cab he verified the odor of raw marijuana. After retrieving some of the paperwork for my inspection from the driver and co-driver I dropped it off inside my patrol vehicle. I went back to the truck and asked both occupants step out. While conducting my interview of the driver and co-driver to find out more information on why some of the paperwork was missing I asked both the driver and co-driver if they had anything illegal in the truck. Both stated they did not. I then told them that I could smell a strong odor of raw marijuana emitting from the cab area of the truck. Both both denied having anything illegal and the owner Mr. Mattocks gave me verbal permission to search the cab and the back box of the truck. Both occupants were very nervous when confronted with the fact we could smell the odor of marijuana. Both the driver Mr. McDonald and co-driver Mr. Mattocks were run thru FCIC/NCIC. Both subjects came

back with no active warrants, however Mr. McDonald had a suspended license for failure to pay a traffic fine for a reckless driving summons he received. Mr. Mattocks came back with a valid NC license. When dispatch ran a criminal history on both subjects Mr. Mattocks had a past for cocaine, marijuana and methamphetamine possession, the driver Mr. McDonald had a past for assault, larceny, and burglary. Since I was given permission by the owner to search his truck, I searched the cab of the truck and did not find any raw marijuana. Dispatch was asked to call K9 and Volusia County Sheriff's office sent a unit. A short time later K9 Deputy Luoma arrived with his K9. Deputy Luoma conducted a walk around search with his dog and the dog alerted to the cab front right and the front right of the box of the truck and the rear of the truck. The deputy and his K9 confirmed that there was a strong odor and he smelled it when he was walking up to the truck. The driver and co-driver opened the back door and the load was not secure, nor were any contents wrapped, no blankets were used between furniture, no braces or straps were used at all to secure the load. The load looked like it had been touched or not loaded securely. Furniture was directly making contact with the sides of the truck and tables and chairs stacked up on top of each other to the ceiling. A search of the truck contents was conducted. A second K9 deputy responded and her name was Deputy Matusick also with Volusia County. The second deputy also conducted a walk around search of the truck and the dog alerted to the same places the first dog had alerted to. At this point the truck was off loaded, the deputies wanted access to the front right side of the box truck. Upon further searching no illegal substances were found, the K9 did alert inside the truck but nothing illegal was found. The driver and co-driver were both instructed to start putting everything back into the truck and both were arguing with the Deputy Luoma. Both the driver and co-driver just sat on a chair not putting the items back on the truck as they were instructed to do. After a while they started to put items back onto the truck. All the troopers present and the deputies were assisting to get the items back onto the truck. While the items were being put back in the truck a rain storm went thru the area and some of the items got wet. The driver and co-driver were told multiple times to put the items away but they were stalling for some reason. The owner was there to witness the event. Two sofas, ten chairs and two tables were out in the rain, we covered the items the best we could to avoid further damage than the one done by the move from Charlotte NC. The owner saw the items had gotten damaged on the trip from Charlotte and asked how things were packed in the truck. The owner now knows the contents were not wrapped as she thought they would have been per their contract and no blankets were used at all to protect each piece of furniture. The owner was upset the driver and co-driver would load the items in such a manner as to not being protected from rubbing against one another and stacked on top of each other with no protective barrier in between each item. The owners of the property saw the items not wrapped or with blankets being put back into the truck. The owner made arrangement to get another truck brought to the location so to load all the contents of their house hold and bring them home. A haul showed up at a later time. Their friends and family assisted with loading the items from the ground to the truck. Once there were no more items left on the ground I had Mr. Mattocks drive the truck to the next exit which was one mile away. Both trucks were moved to Lake Monroe Wayside Park, safer location. When we arrived at the location Mr. Mattocks and Mr. McDonald wanted to leave via a taxi and they did, refusing to allow the owner of the property access to their items. The local police department was called for this civil matter. Seminole County Deputy Pratt arrived and advised them to go ahead and retrieve their items. As they were transferring the contents from one truck to the other Mr. Mattocks and Mr. McDonald showed up again in a taxi. Deputy Pratt explained to them that the owner could not be refused their property and it was a civil case if payment was due for services provided. Mr. Mattocks and Mr. McDonald both left in a taxi and the owner got her property and left as well with the uhaul. Mr. McDonald was issued a citation for operating a commercial motor vehicle involved in interstate commerce without a medical certificate, no log book, improper load securement and for operating a commercial motor vehicle while his license is suspended. The carrier was issued a citation for operating without Operating Authority and for not having a USDOT number displayed per federal regulation. The owner of the truck and co-driver was issued two warnings one for not having a medical certificate and one for not having a log book.
