So when someone is telling her, That lawyer told you you can get a life sentence; that's a lie. Oh, right. Yeah, that's a lie. And 10/20 life doesn't exist. Oh, right. Okay. So we feel it is our duty to really impress upon her that no, we've got to show you, we've got to prove to you. We know you don't believe us, because this guy said not to believe us. But let me show you in black and white. So that was the purpose of that exercise, Judge.

THE COURT: Okay. So, Ms. Jackson, you need to hear loud and clear from me, who would be the

1 judge who would sentence you. If you are convicted
2 as charged, if you were sentenced as an adult as
3 opposed to imposing juvenile sanctions, then I can
4 impose a life sentence. I have the legal authority
5 to do so.

6 If the jury finds you guilty as charged of
7 Attempted First Degree Murder of a Law Enforcement
8 Officer With a Firearm, and I impose adult
9 sanctions, you are subject to 10/20 life. Which,
10 in this case, means it is a 20-year minimum
11 mandatory. Do you understand that?

12 MS. JACKSON: Yes, ma'am.

13 THE COURT: That is not somebody on a phone,
14 from who knows where, saying, No, they can't do
15 that. This is the judge who would sentence you.
16 That doesn't mean that's what I would do. I
17 haven't heard -- Other than generally knowing what
18 is alleged, I haven't heard any facts, and we don't
19 know what the jury would do. But you need to
20 understand that that is a legal sentence under the
21 circumstances as alleged in this case, if the jury
22 convicted you of that charge, and if I impose adult
23 sanctions. Do you understand that?

24 MS. JACKSON: Yes, ma'am.

25 THE COURT: So the -- Hopefully, that

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addresses that question.

Do you have any questions about that?

MS. JACKSON: That topic, no.

THE COURT: So do you understand that, although maybe you didn't receive it that way, the reason your lawyers gave you that information is to try to educate you on the fact that what these people - who say they're going to be your supporters - are telling you, they're giving you bad information and false information? Do you understand that?

MS. JACKSON: Now I do, yes.

THE COURT: Yeah. And that's an -- I mean, this is a huge issue. You're the one who's facing that sentence, if the jury finds you guilty - nobody else. These people - who are claiming to be your supporters and helpers - that you're talking to, or whatever, you know, they are not the ones who are going to come in front of the Court at the end of the day.
