117 **Living room:**

119 Two sets of windows on the north side of the residence were broken inward. A three panel glass patio door adjacent to the pool deck was shattered. One of the panels had a large portion of glass cleared away and it appeared this was most likely how the defendants entered the residence. A flat panel television had damage to the screen that appeared fresh.

123 **Office:**

125 There was an office area located in between the kitchen and master bedroom. It appeared the computer and other items were knocked off the desk. The computer monitor had damage consistent with the damage to the television in the living room.

128 **Master Bedroom:**

130 Behind the bedroom door Det. Mefford observed the names Nicole and Travis carved into the drywall. The thermostat mounted to the wall was broken and appeared to have been struck several times. There were several holes consistent with the size and shape of the pressure washer wand. Det. Mefford also observed the end of the wand had a white powdery substance on it. It appeared two of the ceiling recessed lights had been shot out. A dresser was in the middle of the room with a folding knife sticking in the back of it. There were a couple of stains adjacent to the knife that appeared to be blood. Deputy Mefford attempted to take samples of the stains and a presumptive test later determined they were not blood.

137 The north glass panel door was shattered and there were holes in the vertical blinds consistent with a shotgun spread. (2) spent shot shells were adjacent to the door on the floor. The shot pattern continued out to the pool deck and exited the screen. There is a clear pattern in the screen enclosure with (8) holes in the screen and (1) indentation in the enclosure frame. This is consistent with the type of shot shells found at the scene

140 Winchester Super X 00R which contain (9) pellets.

149 Marker 28 - (2) .22 cartridges - Floor → **THESE WERE NOT FIRED**
150 Marker 29 - Pressure washer wand - Floor
151 Marker 31 - 12 gauge shot shell (fired) - Floor
152 Marker 32 - 12 gauge shot shell (fired) - Floor
153 Marker 33 - .22 Cartridge (Misfire) - On bed

156 **Master Bathroom:**

158 The following items were located in the master bathroom:

160 Marker 30 -Sig magazine and (7) cartridges - Countertop
161 Shoe box with several .45 caliber ammunition boxes and an empty gun box - Closet

163 The master bathroom had an extensive amount of damage. The toilet tank was shattered, the toilet base was cracked, and there was a large amount of standing water on the floor. File boxes, folders, paperwork, and clothing were strewn about the floor. The items had become soaked from the standing water. A flat panel television with extensive damage to the screen was in the bathtub. The glass shower walls and the mirror above the sink was shattered. A single .45 caliber magazine was found on the sink counter.

168 The south window had a large hole in the glass and a series of holes in the blinds consistent with a shotgun blast. Det. Mefford also located a suspected cardboard shotgun wad on the window sill of the south window. Additionally, Det. Mefford observed another hole in the window that penetrated the blinds and the glass. The hole appeared to be a different caliber than that of the shot pellets. Deputy Mefford believed it could have been from one of the fired .22 shell cases found in the master bedroom.

173 The closet was in complete disarray. Clothing, boxes, ammo boxes, and other items were thrown onto the floor. The night of the incident it was advised Bedizel had only three guns (shotgun, AK-47 rifle, and pistol), which the defendants were found to be in possession of. However, Bedizel
